Assignment #2- Read the 8 articles / book excerpts and watch the video links in the "Summer Assignments". Answer the questions. Each article was chosen for a reason and each relates to 1 or more of the units we will study throughout the year.

-Your short answers will be graded on how you *claim, explain*, and provide supporting *examples*. Do not quote heavily, do not write bullet points, and do not write full essays.

-Your responses must be clearly labeled, typed, and printed.

(12.5 points per article for a total of 100 summative points)

Assignment #3- CLEARLY label the maps provided on the last 7 pages of the "Summer Assignments" file with ALL items listed...yes all 309 of them. This year we will be working in the context of this world every day. The better you know the world, the easier this class will be for you.

-I will grade this assignment by selecting 20 items from the list at random and then reviewing your maps. If the items selected are present and correctly labeled you will earn points.

-Maps must be printed.

-Labels must be handwritten.

-You will receive these back as reference tools so color can be helpful.

(5 points per item for a total of 100 summative points)

4. To be able to critically analyze relevant theories and concepts, apply them to specific questions, and then develop a written explanation of the events that demonstrates advanced writing and comprehension skills

The goals of this summer enrichment program will be accomplished by providing students with brief outline of the course, and intensive reading and writing component related to course specific, and a focus on improving the student's ability to read, comprehend, and write at an AP level.
