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School Profile 2014 - 2015

#### **About Our School**

Established in 1959, South Mecklenburg High School has evolved over the last several years to become a vibrant multicultural campus community with an enrollment of over 2,900 students, making our school one of the largest high schools in North Carolina.

South Mecklenburg High School is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and offers a comprehensive college preparatory course of study, including a World Language Magnet program and the Project Lead the Way curriculum in Biomedical Science and Engineering. In addition, in 2013, South Mecklenburg High School launched the IDEA Academy (Innovation, Design, Engineering and Art) for incoming freshman.

The 65-acre, college-style campus is comprised of 13 buildings organized by academic department. The campus has wireless connectivity and our faculty and students utilize technology in the classroom to enhance student learning.

South Mecklenburg High School's strength in academics has been recognized nationally for academic rigor and opportunity. In 2014 the Washington Post rated our school among Best High Schools in North Carolina in their national ranking, and the U.S. News & World Report placed our school 7<sup>th</sup> among the best high school in North Carolina.

#### The Student Body Demographics and Future Plans

The current student population is: 46.1% White; 27.6% African-American; 26.8% Hispanic; 2.9% Asian; 12.3% multiracial other. This year 49% of our students are considered economically disadvantaged, and 6.8% of our student body is classified as Limited English Proficient.

Out of the 560 students in the graduating class of 2014, 47% matriculated to a four-year college or university, 38% matriculated to a community or technical college and 14% enlisted in the military or pursued job opportunities.

#### The Faculty and Staff

The faculty consists of 181 certified staff members, including our principal, four assistant principals, four facilitators, one dean, seven counselors, and the support of two additional counselors assigned through the Communities in Schools program. Among our faculty, 44% hold advanced degrees including four doctorates, and 15 staff members hold National Board certification. With regard to teaching experience, 54% have 5+ years in our district, many with considerable additional experience brought to us from other locations.

#### Curriculum

South Mecklenburg recognizes the wide range of talents and needs that come with a diverse student body, and offers programs that allow each student to pursue their interests and maximize their potential.

- Advanced Placement (AP) and Honors courses are offered in most academic areas. These advanced-level courses are available to students through open enrollment, recognizing that prerequisites, coupled with scheduling constraints, may limit the number of advanced classes available to some students. All students enrolled in AP courses are required to sit for the corresponding course exam at the end of the year.
- A range of elective offerings are provided for all students, including a comprehensive world language program offering studies in Spanish, French, German, and Japanese. Computer Science, Biomedical Science, Engineering, Architecture, Business and Marketing, Health and Physical Education and Visual and Performing Arts complement these opportunities, and we offer a Naval JROTC program for interested students.
- Additional advanced courses and electives are offered on-line through the North Carolina Virtual Public School (NCVPS). These online courses are available to students who demonstrate maturity and an ability to work independently and may be taken during the fall or spring semesters and/or during summer sessions.

#### **Extracurricular Programs**

South Mecklenburg High School supports 34 junior varsity and varsity sports for men and women and has produced athletes that have gone on to successful post graduate careers in the NFL, NBA, MLB, WNBA and the Olympics. In addition, in 2013 the South Mecklenburg High School Baseball team won the NCHSAA 4A State Championship.

South Mecklenburg students also have the opportunity to participate in a wide range of special interest clubs and service organizations. Many of these have won national and regional recognition, including curricular organizations associated with CTE coursework including but not limited to a very successful HOSA chapter, Science Olympiad, Odyssey of the Mind and Future Problem Solvers. Multiple honor societies at South Mecklenburg High School include the National Honor Society, BETA Club and content-specific honor organizations. South Mecklenburg High School also has very active bands, orchestra, yearbook, and performing and visual arts extracurricular programs.

## **Graduation Requirements**

Students are required to have 24 credits for graduation and must pass North Carolina State End of Course exams in designated core academic courses. In addition, all graduates must complete a comprehensive Graduation Project, which involves completion of a research paper at the end of junior year and a thirty minute final presentation to a panel of judges at the conclusion of senior year.

## **Academic Profiles for the Class of 2014**

- Classes are offered on a hybrid 4x4 block and A/B schedule.
- Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools uses a 7 point grading system and does not utilize pluses/minuses.
- GPA is based on a 4 point scale: A=4.0, B=3.0, C=2.0, D=1.0, F=0. Weighted courses receive extra quality points: One extra quality point is added for each Honors course and foreign language courses beyond the second level. Two extra quality points are added for Advanced Placement courses and select Project Lead the Way courses.
- GPA is computed by dividing the total number of quality points earned by the total number of courses taken in grades 9-12.
- Class rank is determined by the weighted GPA on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the first semester of the junior year and subsequently on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of each semester thereafter. Graduates' ranks are computed at the end of their final semester. The chart below shows the class rank profile for the graduating class of 2014. Interim class rank information for current seniors (class of 2015) can be found on the student's official school transcript.
