What are Smiley Face Tricks? Smiley Face Tricks are compositional risks. These tricks will improve your writing and make it more colorful, exciting and interesting. Once we finish reviewing the terms, you will be expected to include various tricks in every writing assignment that you turn in.

Your group will be making a poster or a Google Slide presentation to demonstrate your understanding of some of our Smiley Face Tricks.

Your poster/Google Slide presentation should:

~Include an example of each trick that we review as a class

~Be colorful, creative and neat

~Be free of errors in spelling, punctuation, grammar and capitalization

~For posters: The print should be big enough to read from a few feet away. Don't forget to use a ruler and please refrain from using yellow marker for the words that you are writing!

~Must include one example of every term that we discuss (ten in total). Try to include names of each group member in the final project examples. Be creative! Do not settle for what you are "comfortable" with. Push yourselves to be thoughtful and original! For example, "The boy ran as fast as a cheetah," is overused and unexciting.
