

### WHAT ARE SOME OF YOUR FAVORITE ACTIVITIES TO DO WITH THE KIDS?


Jenna enjoys playing "Apples to Apples", running the snack bar, and hanging out at the skate park Cameron loves playing air-hockey and basketball.




### **THE Game**






Every year, the battle between The Ohio State Buckeyes and Michigan Wolverines is something of legendary status. The rivalry has been vigorous and uninterrupted since 1918! Last year was the first time since **2011** that the Wolverines have beaten the Buckeyes. This year, the game was played in Columbus and the blood for both sides was boiling as they both came into the game undefeated. Even the coaches had some beef going as Michigan Coach, **Jim** Harbaugh talked about Ohio State's Coach, Ryan Day, being handed everything once he took the Head Coach job in 2018. The game started off perfect for the Buckeyes as Heisman Trophy favorite **C.J.Stroud** threw a perfect pass to Sophomore Receiver **Emeka Egbuka** in the endzone to cap off a great drive down the field. Michigan marched down the field the next drive, scoring a field goal making it an offensive game. Michigan's star running back, **Blake Corum**, took two snaps but did not play for the rest of the game due to a leg injury which occurred the previous game. In the end, OSU's plan of stopping the run collapsed when Michigan Quarterback, J.J. McCarthy capitalized and threw for 263 yards with 3 touchdowns. The Buckeyes offense looked to be firing on all cylinders but their defense couldn't contain the Michigan Wolverine's powerful offense. The Wolverines upset the Buckeyes, with a final score of **45-23**. This was the first time the Wolverines have beaten the Buckeyes in the Horseshoe since 2000!
