- GUIDELINES FOR CER
  - Answer the following questions (using the same format) when you Post a Discussion on Canvas.

Claim:

- What was the question?
- What was the candidate's response?

Evidence:

- What SPECIFIC evidence did the candidate use to support his Claim? (using a claim to support a claim is not using evidence. Strong evidence is a peer-reviewed fact supported by data collected from multiple sources.)

Reasoning:

- How did the candidate apply evidence to support his Claim?

- ★ RULES FOR DISCUSSION, Serious Stuff

1. Respect ALL Points of View, especially if they differ from your own. Allowing people to **respectfully** speak their minds paves the way for social change.
2. Think about what you are going to type before you type it. This is an emotionally charged election, people's Civil Rights are on the line: be nice, even if the president is not.
3. Hateful speech, language, or slurs WILL ABSOLUTELY NOT BE TOLERATED. Any actions of this kind (on-line or off-line) will be immediately reported to your assistant principal and guardian and will result in SEVERE consequences.

1. When you **DISAGREE** with a point you must:
  - a. First, think of what you disagree with: the claim, the evidence, or the reasoning, and exactly why you disagree using a claim and evidence for that claim.
  - b. Second, write down what you disagreed with (C, E, or R)
  - c. Third, write down why you disagreed with that C, E, or R.
    - i. You must use a claim and a piece of evidence. You will not get credit for this E.C. assignment if you do not use a claim and evidence to support your disagreement.
  - d. PROOFREAD - make sure your response is **objective and respectful**.
  
2. When you **AGREE** with a point you must:
  - a. First, think of why you agree.
    - i. To do this you must think of a supporting **claim** that you reinforce with *similar evidence*. Then think of the **reason** you believe this evidence supports both claims (your supporting claim and the OP's claim).
  - b. Second, write down and post your
    - i. Supporting **claim**
    - ii. Similar **evidence**
    - iii. **Reasoning** why your evidence supports your claim and the OP's claim.
  - c. PROOFREAD - make sure your response is **objective and respectful**.
