Essential Knowledge	<ul> <li>There are 5 themes in geography:         <ol> <li>Location</li> <li>Location may be absolute or relative.</li> <li>Absolute location is determined by longitude and latitude.</li> <li>Relative location is described by landmarks, time, direction or distance from one place to another.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Place         <ol> <li>Place can be defined in terms of climate, physical features, or the people who live there and their traditions.</li> <li>Human Environment Interaction</li> <li>Human environment interaction can be defined by how people adapt, modify and depend on the environment.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Movement         <ol> <li>The movement of people, the import and export of goods, and mass communication have all played major roles in shaping our world.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Region         <ol> <li>Region is the basic unit of study in geography which can include: area, language, political divisions, religions and vegetation(for example, grassland, marshland, desert, rain forest).</li> </ol> </li> <li>Maps provide us with information about the 5 themes of geography.</li> <li>The five themes of geography can be used to explain why a city was developed in a particular region.</li> </ul>
