Course Description and Overview of Content	Students will learn a wide variety of information related to U.S. Geography, Government, Citizenship, Economics, and Important People in History. Many/all of the of the following concepts will be covered: *Using maps, graphs, and charts to gain information *Cardinal and Intermediate directions *Branches of government and responsibility of each *Political parties *Election of a president *American Revolution *Understanding and origin of the US Constitution, Bill of Rights, and Declaration of Independence *Westward Expansion *Acquisition of the United States *Slavery/Underground Railroad *Civil War (differences between the North and the South) *Core Democratic Values/Citizenship *Current events *Civil Rights Movement and dynamic individuals of this period
Course Goal/ Intended Outcomes	Students will gain an understanding of the United States, including the physical characteristics and the political aspects. They will explore what it means to be a US citizen, and the rights that Americans have in our country. Students will learn about the events that took place in history to shape America to what it is today. A large focus will be on Colonial Life, the American Revolution, Westward Expansion, and Slavery. Students will also learn about the important individuals that have impacted history.

Students will be given time in class to complete ability-appropriate work. If the work is not finished, it will be taken home and returned the next day in order to receive full credit.
Academic Integrity	All students must complete their own work. Cheating, or having another individual complete the work for them, will result in disciplinary action and may result in loss of a credit.
