

Assignment:

1. Please read chapter 4, 5 and 6
 - *verbs, all of them tiring*
 - *like any other thing, a gift*
 - *ashes of roses*
2. Prepare a total of 5 good, thought questions for a Socratic Seminar. You should have at least one question based on each chapter. Chapter 5 (*like any other thing, a gift*) is an Inman chapter, on which we will focus much of our discussion. Please come up with at least 2 questions for this chapter.
3. The questions should move beyond a literal, plot inquiry. Rather, your questions should be able to elicit a rich discussion. Consider theme, figurative language, conflict, allusion, etc.
4. This seminar is different from previous ones we have had. We will be discussing a new section of the novel. Be sure your questions and contributions help progress our understanding of the novel, its themes and recurring motifs.
5. During the discussion:
 - your goal should be to speak at least 3 times.
 - please consider what your classmates say before you respond.
 - keep your responses grounded in the text. Try to demonstrate knowledge of the text by referring to specific examples and quotes.
