## Ingress instructions

- Students to line up outside six feet apart
- Mask must be worn at all times
- Temperature checks at the door
- Feet must be disinfected with the floor mat

- there will be designated entrance for each grade level
- After entering the building students must report directly to their homeroom

- Doors open at 8AM (Grab and go breakfast)
