## South Dakota Elks Association Vocational Scholarship Guidelines

1. Applicants must be enrolled or planning to enroll in an accredited post-secondary technical or vocational program which terminates with completion of that program. Applicants shall have no immediate or long range plans to pursue a baccalaureate degree program.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: If the student's plans change and the student enrolls in a 4 year college, the applicant becomes ineligible for the grant and must contact their local Elks Lodge immediately.

- 2. All scholarship are in the form of certificates of award issued by the State Elks Office conditioned upon the enrollment of the student in a technical degree program in an accredited American post-secondary school. Upon receipt of a verification of enrollment from proper school officials, a South Dakota Elks Association check in the amount of the award (\$1,000.00) will be forwarded to the post-secondary school to establish credit for the student.
- 3. Directions: Fill out the application completely.
- 4. A completed application must also attach the following:
  - a) Official transcript from the student's high school;
  - b) A 350 to 500 word typed essay about the student. This should include a description of the applicant, the applicant's financial needs, the applicant's involvement in extracurricular and community activities, and a summary of the applicant's intended career plans and goals. Explain the course of study or other activities taken to prepare for the student's anticipated career;
  - c) At least two (2) letters of reference/recommendation from someone (not related to the student) who knows the student and the student's career goals. One letter of recommendation must be from a community member not associated with the school system.
