

Learning For Justice is a website that has lesson plans for teachers and professional development for schools, businesses and policy makers. The original magazine, Teaching Tolerance was published to prevent the growth of hate by reducing prejudice. The Southern Law Poverty Center assist in publishing the new website and magazine, and film chronicling the civil rights movement. Learning for Justice's website has toolkits, lesson plans, films, and professional development. Their lesson plans also have many resources to teach reading strategies. They discuss comfort levels for students who are participating in lesson on civil rights.
