Lucky Three – Divide your paper into three columns. In one column, write all your words in print. In the second column, write all your words in cursive, and in the last column, think of a creative way to write your words.		
Bubble Letters – write all of your spelling words in bubble letters.		
Fraction Spelling – Write the fraction of consonants and vowels in each word. (Example: CAT consonants 2/3, vowels 1/3).		
CBA Order – Write your words in backwards ABC order. (Please note: The words aren't spelled backwards, the ABC order is just backwards.)		
Across and Down – Write each spelling word across and using the first letter of the word, write it down. Example:


Week of Sept. 12-More Plural Nouns


