

Bullying Prevention Program begins at St. Rose Elementary School

All schools deal with the issue of bullying. St. Rose Elementary School is taking proactive steps to prevent and stop bullying by adopting the *Olweus Bullying Prevention Program*. This research-based schoolwide "systems-change" program has been used successfully in schools all over the country and around the world with positive results.

This program is not a curriculum that students participate in for only a few weeks. Rather, it is a coordinated effort by all the adults in the school to supervise and intervene when any bullying happens. As part of the program, students participate in weekly class meetings to learn about the effects of bullying, what they can do about it, and how they can work with adults at school to put a stop to it, even as bystanders. Parents will meet, too, so they can support the messages students are getting in school.

Lisa Perrin, St. Rose Elementary School's principal, said, "This type of program is about changing the whole school climate to make it a safer, more positive place to learn. One change that many schools have noticed after using this program for a year or two is that students actually like school better."

Implementing the *Olweus Bullying Prevention Program* is a long-term commitment to making St. Rose Elementary School a safer, more positive place to be.

Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA)

Notice: In 1986 all asbestos materials were identified in all school buildings. A management plan was developed for each school as per the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA). The management plan is located in a binder in the main office of each school. The binders are available for review upon request.

Since the plan was developed, most of the asbestos has been removed. In a few buildings, some floor tile still remains that contains asbestos. All of the schools meet the health requirements that pertain to the regulation. 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Migrant Education Services Available!

Any child, ages 3 through 21, who moves with parents or guardians to seek or obtain temporary or seasonal employment in agriculture, or fishing-related activities is eligible for the Migrant Education Program. Families qualify if they have moved to work in traditional crops such as: vegetables, dairy, poultry, livestock, fishing and shrimping, and/or timber.

Migrant Education provides student advocacy within the school district's educational program as well as supplemental educational and supportive services.

If you believe that your child might qualify for this program and are interested please call the school secretary or stop by the office to complete the Migrant Survey.

- Access the app store on your smartphone. (in the APP Store or Google Play)
- Search for SchoolDude CrisisManager.
- Install the app to your device.

Accessing Your Plan

- Open your CrisisManager app from your smartphone.
- Tap Create Account.
- Enter your Email Address and Password.

*Note: The password you set must meet the following requirements:

Between 8 and 40 characters in length.

Have at least one Uppercase character.

Have at least one Lowercase character.

Have at least one Numeric character.

Have at least one Other character.

- Tap Create Account when finished.
- Once your account has been created you will be sent an email confirmation. Click on the link provided in the email to complete the confirmation process.
- After you have completed the confirmation process, you will need to log back into the app. Go back to your CrisisManager app on your smartphone and tap **Back**.
- Enter your Email Address and Password and tap Login.
- Tap on + Client Plans, find St. Charles Parish Public Schools in the list, and select it.
- Tap on Parent/Guardian Emergency Guide.
- The plan will then download and appear on your CrisisManager home page.
- Tap on the plan to view.

Establishing and maintaining a good parent-teacher partnership is important for a successful school year. When parents effectively communicate with their child's teacher, lasting positive, respectful relationships are formed.

Remember to be mindful of what you say in front of your children...they are listening!

Parent-teacher conferences are essential building blocks for home-school communication. Teachers need parents to help to do the best job educating each child. Parents provide important perspectives and information. The teacher can, in turn, help parents play an active role in education at home. Children are more likely to succeed in school if they view their parents and teachers working together cooperatively.

Preparation is the key to a successful conference. Here are some things you can do before, during and after the conference.

BEFORE	DURING	AFTER
Make a list of things to tell your child's teacher like medical concerns, difficulties in school, sensitive issues, favorite subjects, etc. Make a list of things to ask your child's teacher (see list below). Let your child know you are having a conference. Ask for input about what should be discussed with the teacher.	Be on time. Many conferences are scheduled. Five minutes can throw off their schedule. Start the conference on a positive note. Both you and the teacher want what's best for your child. Use the list you prepared or the questions below. Listen carefully and take notes about your child's progress.	Talk over results of the conference with your child. Stress the good things the teacher said. Talk about the suggestions made during the conference and how you plan to carry these out.

Questions for Your Parent-Teacher Conference

Choose the most important questions you would like to ask the teacher. Write any additional comments you want to remember to mention when you are with the teacher.

They will learn about the Elements of Design (line, shape, space, color, value, texture, form) and the Principles of Design (balance, emphasis, contrast, rhythm, unity). Students will be exposed to a wide variety of art mediums (paint, marker, pastel, clay, etc.). Students will learn to critique their own work and the work of many famous artists.

Some of the art materials we use may stain clothing. I highly encourage each child to bring a very large T-shirt to school that can be worn over his/her uniform on the day they have art each week. These T-shirts should be labeled with your child's first and last name, teacher's name as well as his/her grade level.

During the year, we use many items that can be found in your homes.
