COURSE SYLLABUS: PHILOSOPHY

Course Overview and Essential Skills

This course provides an introduction to philosophical thought which looks at questions regarding human nature and the world around us. Students will explore the major philosophical schools of thought which include Logic and Reason, Aesthetics, Epistemology, Ethics, Metaphysics, and Existentialism and investigate how great philosophers have addressed these throughout history. Students will learn how to discuss, analyze, clarify and create arguments that will help them to be successful in an academic context.
