National Geographic Learning Academic Testing Center: Texas HOSA is pleased to announce that five National Geographic Learning Academic Testing Center events normally only available at the ILC, will be offered at the Texas State Leadership Conference. There is a \$5.00 charge to take each test and each participant is limited to two tests. All students registered for the state conference are eligible to participate. The five testing events are:

- 1. AAFP Family Medicine Career Test
- 2. Leadership Test
- 3. Occupational Health and Safety Test
- 4. Biology Test
- 5. Chemistry Test

The goal of the National Geographic Learning (NGL) Academic Testing Center – CERI sponsored event is to provide as many HOSA Members at both the Texas State Leadership Conference and the International Leadership Conference as possible with the opportunity to demonstrate their basic knowledge in preparation to become future health professionals. The series of events in the NGL Academic Testing Center (ATC) are written tests based on items from the identified text specific to each event. Competitors will recognize, identify, define, interpret, and apply knowledge in a 50-item multiple choice test with a tiebreaker question. The written test will measure knowledge and understanding at the recall, application, and analysis levels. Higher-order thinking skills will be incorporated.
