Not checking school email creates a problem, however, if we are trying to efficiently broadcast information that may be useful to you


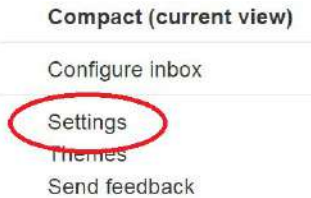

- ❑ as you plan your future,

- ❑ if you are interested in finding volunteer opportunities or internships.

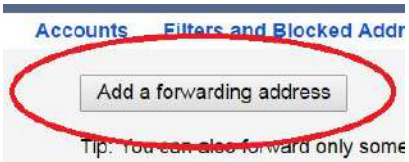

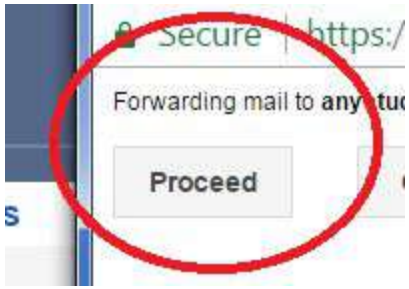
There are many other reasons, but these will do for a start.

So what can you do to solve the problem? There is an easy solution! Most students also have a *personal* email address, one that we hope that you check more often. So why not have all of your school emails forwarded to your personal account?

How, you might ask?

Just turn on the **forwarding** feature of your student Gmail account. It's easy. Just follow these simple steps:

1.	Open your student Gmail account.	
2.	Hover over the gear, then click on <i>Settings</i> .	
3.	Click on <i>Settings</i> again.	
4.	Click the <i>Forwarding and POP/IMAP</i> tab
