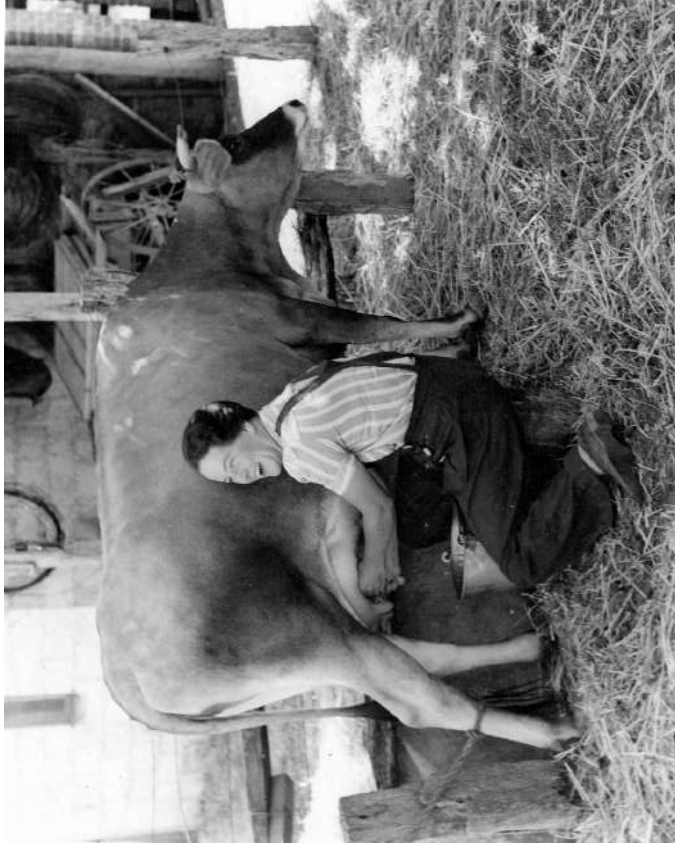

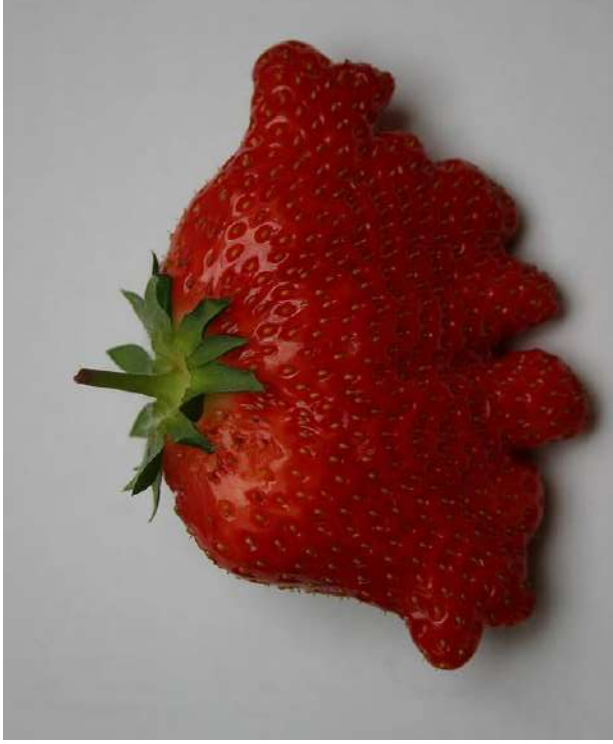
(n.) a tradesperson who melts hot iron and uses tools to make metal objects such as horseshoes, tools, and cooking utensils

(n.) a tradesperson who runs a mill that grinds wheat or corn into flour

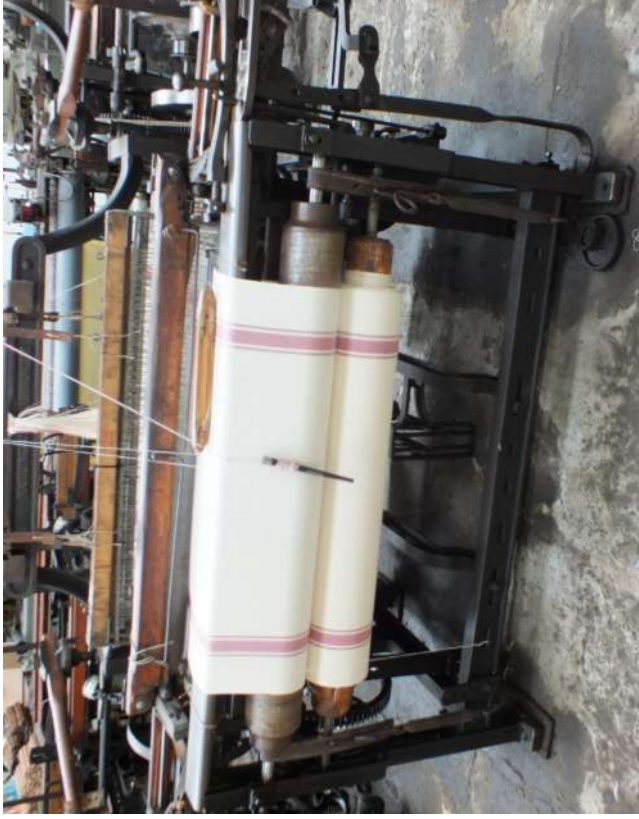

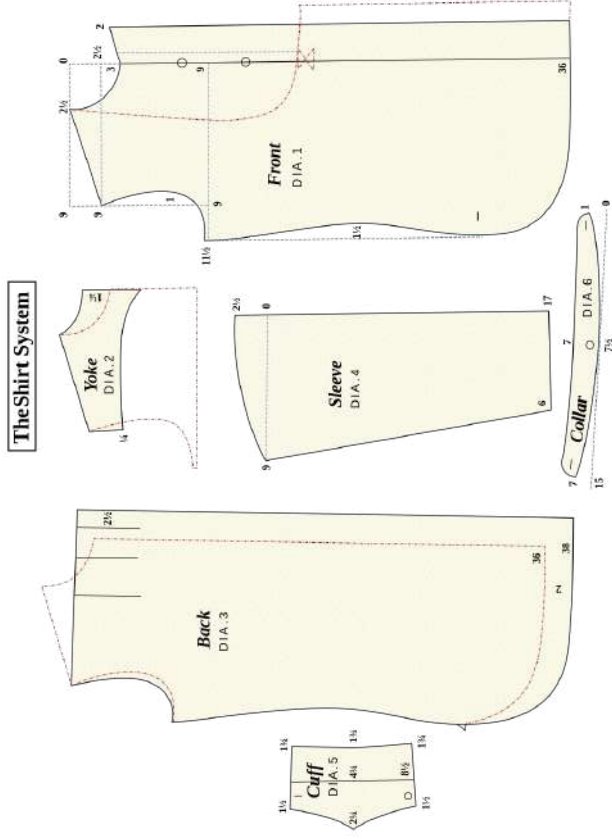

(n.) a special kind of oven or fireplace used by a blacksmith to heat iron



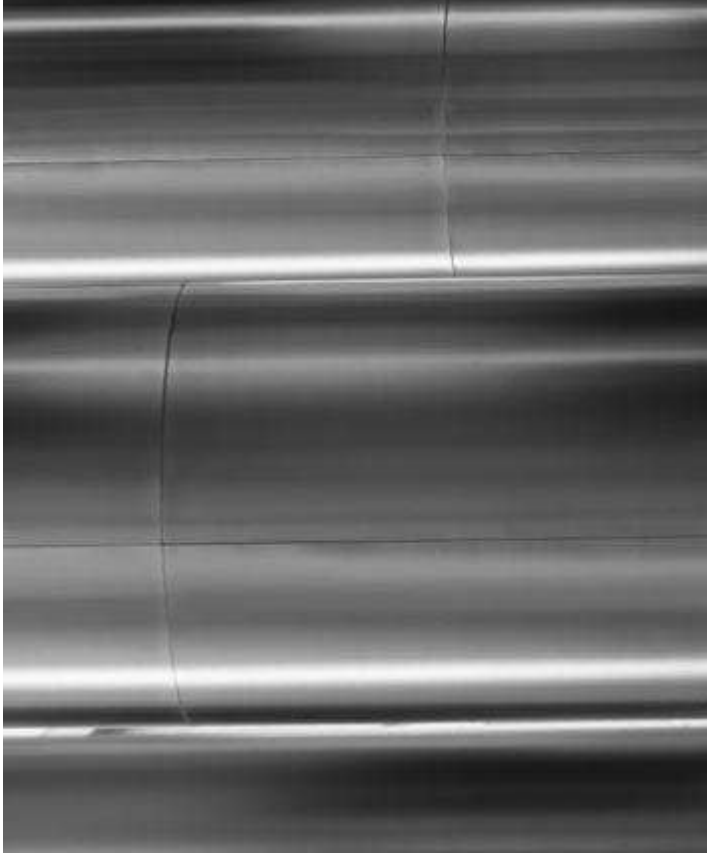

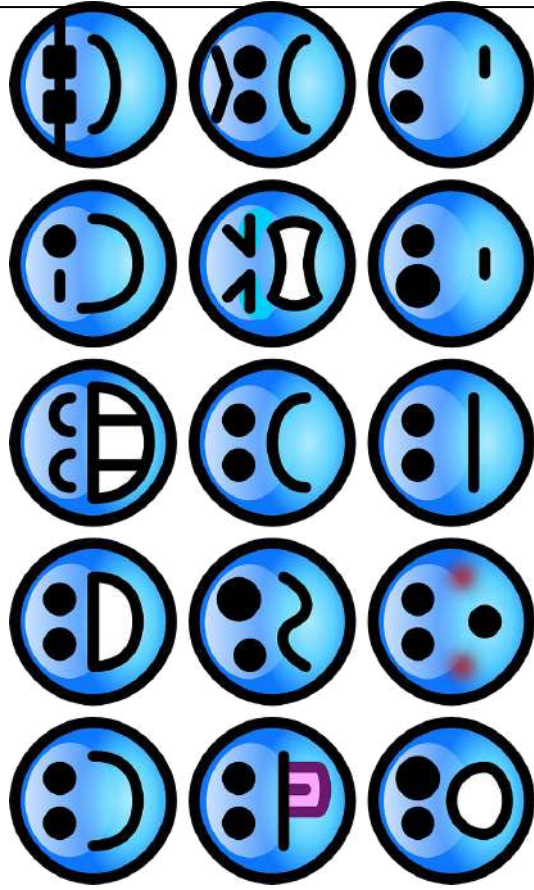
