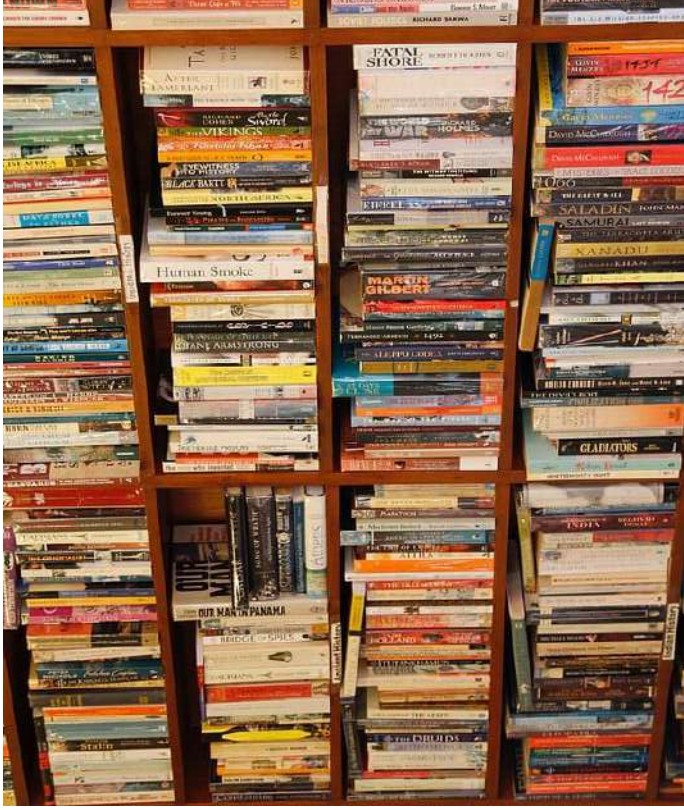

for a while and then return it



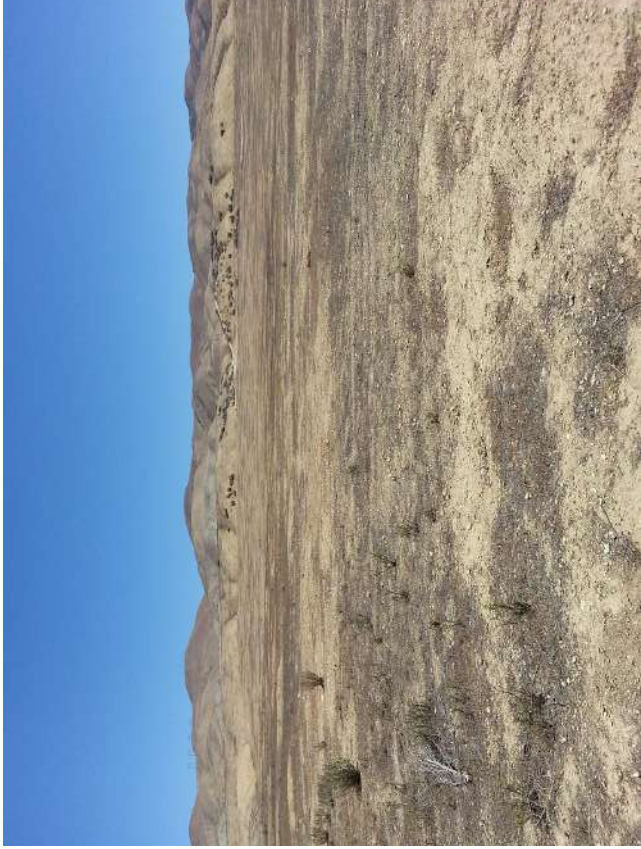

parfleche

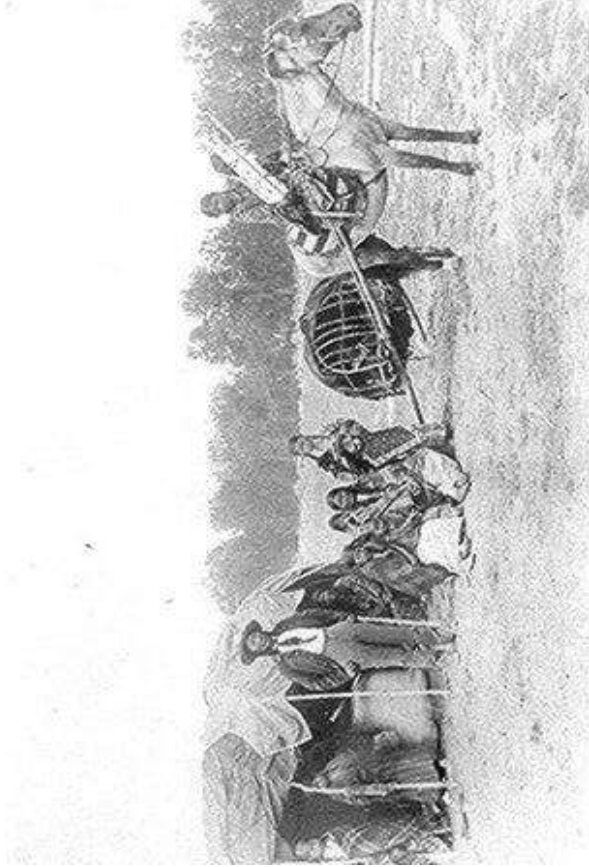
(n.) a small bag made from animal hide

(n.) a type of sled used to carry a tipi and other belongings



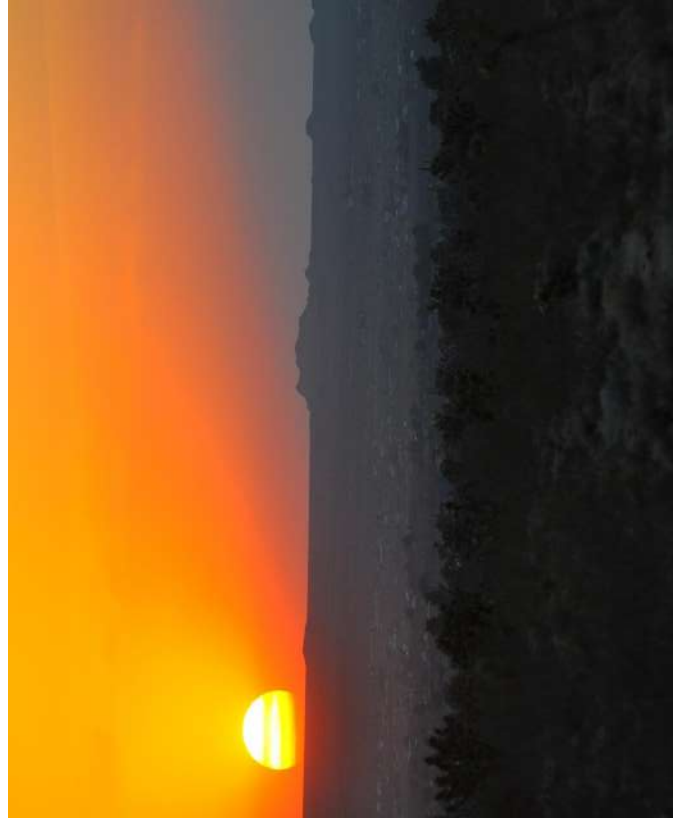

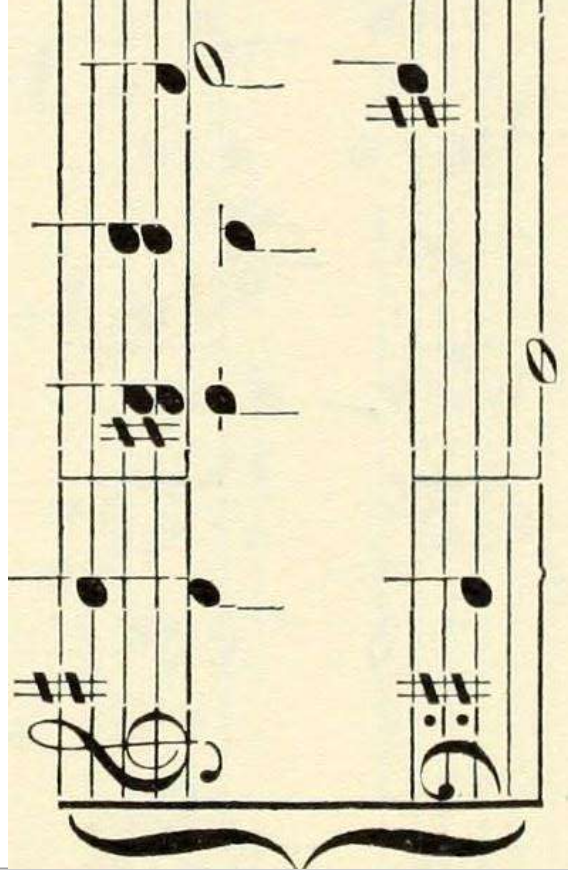
(n.) cone-shaped tents made from long poles and covered with animal skins
