Sticky Note Strategy to Narrow PGEs for MOC

1. Write each professional development/learning activity that you have completed/attended since certification on a separate sticky note - courses, workshops, book studies, research, learning through committee work, webinars, self-study, etc.

2. Stack sticky notes that relate to each other in piles. The goal is to form 2 piles, each of which can become a PGE for MOC. (Some likely will not fit – that is okay, you won't use everything you've done.) One of the PGEs will be used for you instructional video in your original certificate area and developmental level (age group). NOTE: Previous Renewal required 4 PGEs.

3. Look at your piles. That learning was a focus because of a need - your need, your students' needs, or your district's need. Identify the need you were meeting when you did that learning.

4. Now you are ready to write your PGEs: Need, what you did to address the need, and student impact.
