Students must have maintained a 93% overall average at the end level IV in order to wear the honors cord at graduation. All criteria must be met and maintained. All members of a World Language Honor Society are evaluated each year to ensure that they continue to meet the grade criteria outlined above. Failure to maintain the specified grade requirements will result in dismissal from the World Language Honor Society, and the student's name will be deleted from the list of World Language Honor Society Members. The student will then be unable to include his/her membership in the World Language Honor Society on his/her college application.
