

Students who are not proficient will have the opportunity to remediate and retake the test on two days at the end of the school year after the last day of school. If students still do not show proficiency on their second attempt of the exam, they will be prescribed additional course work to allow them to increase their understanding of the material and show mastery of the content in an alternative way the following school year.
