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

FOLD-N-LEARN PROJECT SUGGESTIONS

Follow the instructions below to create a fun study aid. This aid will help you review the vocabulary on pages 234–235, 237, 246–247, and 249 of your textbook.

MATERIALS You will need paper, a stapler, and a pen or pencil.

STEP 1 Lay one sheet of paper on top of the other. Slide the top sheet up so that one inch of the bottom sheet is showing.



STEP 2 Holding the two sheets of paper together, fold down the top of each sheet so that you have three one-inch flaps showing along the bottom.



STEP 3 Secure the layered booklet with staples. On the top, or cover page, write **En plein air.**



STEP 4 On the three one-inch flaps, write the categories **On fait du camping, La nature,** and **Les activités** as shown. Then find the chapter words and expressions for each category and write them on the page with the category name. Include the English equivalents on the back of each page.
