How to RESEARCH: Look up additional artist images on your phone/computer/books. Look up the definitions and examples of the genres listed below. Use class notes as needed. You may discuss genres etc. with your classmates, however you must form your own opinion and submit original writing. These will be collected for a grade and returned with feedback.

CRITICAL WRITING PROMPTS - ANSWER ALL OF THEM IN COMPLETE SENTENCES.

- 1. Name the artist, title, and date.
- 2. **CONTENT:** Describe exactly what is in the image. EVERYTHING.
- 3. **EMPHASIS:** What stands out the MOST? Explain why/how. What makes it stand out?
- 4. **CONTEXT:** As you keep looking, does anything else seem important? Why?
- 5. **GENRE:** What style/genres/media could this image be categorized as?
- 6. **INTENT:** What meaning/feeling do you think the artist meant to convey? Get in their head! What do you think they had to go through in order to create this image?
- 7. **OPINION:** Do you like/dislike the image? Why did you select this one? Explain your reason for liking or being critical. Do you think you can make a picture like this? Will you?
- 8. **BONUS:** Do a thumbnail sketch of the artwork in your critical writing (5-10 minutes).

Use at least 5-10 vocabulary words in your writing.

VOCABULARY WORD BANK:

line, shape, value, form, space, texture, contrast, color, texture, unity, balance, emphasis, rhythm, pattern, movement, variety, symmetry, composition, organic, fluid, aesthetic, intent, rule of thirds, figure to ground, leading lines, etc . . .
