Summary of First Title I Planning Meeting December 3, 2019

Thomas E. Kerns held the first Title I Planning Meeting on December 3, 2019. The purpose was to review student data, as well as, a closer look at the impact of currently-funded Title I components. Parent and Teacher Survey results were also reviewed.

Spring testing results indicate an improvement from "Unsatisfactory" to "Average" on the state report card. First quarter Mastery Connect Benchmark data for ELA shows the school's projected proficiency at 36.7% and the Math projected proficiency for the school at 49.3%. Student performance is at a higher level after the first quarter's instruction when compared to last year.

Parent Surveys indicate:

164 surveys returned compared to 153 returned in 2018 -2019

98% felt welcome at TEK

The most popular means of communicating workshops to families were newsletters, phone calls and flyers.

The most popular teacher communications were phone calls/Dojo.

Providing varied times allowed more parent participation in workshops
