

Registration opens March 11 and remains open until at least a week before the class starts. Please call us if registration is closed to see if we can fit you in. If the class is filled or cancelled. registration immediately closes. Registrations are accepted on a firstcome, first-served basis.

Don't delay registering for the class you want to take. Decisions to cancel a class based on low enrollment are made the week before the class starts.

Don't miss your chance to register!

Please note:

You will only hear from us in the event of a class change, class cancellation, or if the class is full. Online registrants will receive an email confirmation if an email address is provided.

Cancellations Adults

Customer-initiated cancellations received within 5 or more business days prior to the start of the class will qualify for a refund minus a non-refundable \$10 processing fee, per person, for each class cancelled. Cancellations made less than 5 business days prior to the start date of the class will not be eligible for a refund. There are no refunds issued after the class has begun. Remember, if you are unable to attend a class, you can notify us and send another adult to take your place. Community Education reserves the right to cancel any class that does not meet the minimum enrollment. You will be contacted and complete refunds will be given when this occurs.

Youth

Registration is due prior to the start of class. Cancellations received within 5 or more business days prior to the start of the class will qualify for a refund minus a non-refundable \$10 processing fee, per child, per class. Cancellations made less than 5 business days prior to the start date of the class will not be eligible for a refund. There are no refunds issued after the class has begun. There are no makeups for missed classes by the student. Community Education may cancel a class due to low enrollment. A parent or guardian will be contacted in the event a class is cancelled.

Vouchers

Vouchers will be issued for cancellations by Community Education due to inclement weather. This will apply to multi-session classes only, where a make-up date cannot be set. Check or credit card refunds will no longer be given. Vouchers are limited to the same type and price of class. Examples of a class cancellation where a participant would receive a voucher: Swimming Lessons, Piano Lessons, Fitness Classes.

Registration Notes

Adults with disabilities who need a sign language interpreter, note taker or other accommodations to participate in Community Education classes should call Learning Exchange at 952-681-6121 or email jclarke@isd271.org at least 10 business days prior to the start of class.

Class confirmations are only sent to those who enroll in classes online. You will receive an immediate receipt/confirmation message. For all other registrations, assume you are in the class unless you hear from us.

Adult classes have a minimum age requirement of 16 years or older (unless otherwise indicated).

Financial aid is available for low income youth and adults. Call 952-681-6108 for more information.

In the event of bad weather, you will receive either a call, email, or text from Bloomington Community Education if classes are cancelled.

UCare MN members may take a discount of up to \$15 on most classes. If class is less than \$15, members may take the class free of charge. Members must be on UCare at the time of registration and need to include their member ID number on the registration. Some limitations may apply. Participants must register by phone, mail, or in person to receive discount.

Your privacy is important to us. The registration information you provide to Bloomington Community Education is considered private data under state and federal law. We use the information you provide for the purposes of administering the activity and to contact you about upcoming activities. While you may choose to withhold this information, there may be consequences that could limit the distribution of information to the participant (e.g. no team roster or class confirmation.) Access to contact information is limited to individuals involved in the activity.

Unless you notify Bloomington Community Education, photos and videos taken within Bloomington Community Education classes, programs and activities may be included in Community Education publications in print and online.

Early Childhood Screening is a free program in Minnesota that checks how a child is developing and growing. Included are vision and hearing tests, as well as screening for development, health and other factors that may affect your child's growth. Screening is FREE and should be completed as soon as possible after your child's 3rd birthday. Call: 952-681-6200.



Early Learning Services

Early Learning Services is a Four-Star Parent-Aware rated program encompassing Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE), Early Childhood Screening, and Preschool programming for three-year-olds and four-year-olds. Programming is located at Pond Center and Southwood Center offering both ECFE and preschool classes, as well as preschool programming at four of Bloomington Public Schools elementary schools: Valley View Elementary, Washburn Elementary, Indian Mounds Elementary and Oak Grove Elementary. Early Learners Academy

Early Learners Academy is a Four-Star Parent-Aware rated, allday early



education program for children ages 3-5 that focuses on child care and preparing students for kindergarten. The Academy is housed within four Bloomington Public Schools award-winning elementary schools. All sites are open from 6:30 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Early Childhood Family Education: ECFE

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) is based on the belief that parents provide their child's first and most significant learning environment; parents/caregivers are children's first and most enduring teachers. ECFE works to support you as a parent/caregiver to strengthen and empower families. ECFE is an opportunity to meet other parents and learn about parenting with licensed parent educators. Children learn valuable play skills while playing with other children. These play skills are grounded in educational standards and taught by licensed early childhood teachers. The classes are for children and their parent(s)/caregiver(s) who are newborn through age 5.

Baby Beginnings: Birth - 12 months

Whether this is your first child or 3rd, baby classes are for you!

Our infant classroom is designed with you and your baby in mind. Come in comfortable clothes ready to sing and play with your baby along with meeting other parents/caregivers with children the same age. The teacher will provide support and research-based materials that will help lay a foundation for your child's development. Topics will focus on social emotional. language, and motor just to name a few of the developmental areas. Sleep, nutrition and self-care are often discussed weekly.

This is a non-separating class.

Movers: One-Year-Olds

They never stop, and you never stop during this 2nd year of life!

Our licensed teachers are ready and excited to share in that passion for learning. Toys and activities are provided to help learning occur; on the move! Classroom staff, who move at the pace of young children and understand how to create learning that is age appropriate, are ready with short, large group times, simple songs, bubbles, and low shelves so toddlers can learn independently. All areas of development will be taught whether through classroom design or direct teaching. As children are ready, a parent educator will spend time with parents talking about the many developmental pieces of raising a one-year-old.

This is a gradual separation class.

Explorers: Two-Year-Olds

If there is something to learn a two-year-old will find it!

Two-year-olds are not babies anymore and they are not preschoolers yet. They are taking on new challenges everyday and classroom staff are ready and prepared for all the adventures. New words, new friends, new feelings are all part of the two-yearold's experience at school. Classrooms are set up for discovery across all domains of learning. While parents are in class with a parent educator discussing tantrums, toilet learning and cognitive growth, classroom staff provide direct teaching using age appropriate classroom materials.

This is a gradual separation class.

Play & Learn: Birth to 5 years

Our Play & Learn classes are designed to give you focused time with your child. Classrooms are set up for discovery and hands-on learning. A licensed early childhood teacher will plan developmental activities, sing songs, and read stories that you and your child can enjoy together.. Your child will also have time to run, jump, slide and crawl in our motor room.

This is a non-separating class.

Step into Preschool:

Is your child not yet old enough for 3-year-old preschool?

Step into Preschool is designed for children who turn 3 between September 1, 2020- May 1, 2021.

Children will get a taste of what preschool is like in this class. A licensed teacher will provide opportunities for children to work on social, language and literacy skills through read alouds, conversation and singing with friends and adults other than their caregivers. Playtime in the motor room and gym will all be included throughout the day as well.

This class will meet September-May.

Preschool

Preschool is an exciting time in your child's life. The Bloomington preschool program is committed to preparing your child for success in kindergarten and beyond! Curriculum is based on the MN Early Childhood Indicators of Progress. Parent involvement sessions are held throughout the year. Our licensed teachers help children discover a love for learning!

Three-Year-Old Preschool

We offer 3-year-old preschool for 2.5 hours a day for 3 days per week (M/W/F) or 2 days per week (T/Th) at both Pond and Southwood Centers.

Four-Year-Old Preschool

We offer 4-year-old preschool 5 days per week (M-F) for 2.5 hours at Pond and Southwood Centers and for those who live in the attendance areas of Valley View, Washburn, Indian Mounds, and Oak Grove Elementary sections at those schools.

Preschool registration for 2020-2021 is open

What if Bloomington Public Schools are closed or have an early release?

Early Learning Services will also be closed (ECFE, Screening and Preschool). There are no refunds for cancelled classes due to weather or emergencies.

Early Childhood Special Education

While all children grow at their own rate, some children experience delays in their development. Special health conditions may also affect children's development. Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) offers (at no cost to families) information, support and referral services that may help a child and family. ECSE provides free special education services, including special education teacher support, occupational therapy, physical therapy, and/or speech and language therapy, to children from ages birth to kindergarten. These services can be provided in a variety of settings including in your home, in a school-based early childhood program, or in community-based childcare. Children are eligible for Early Childhood Special Education through a special education evaluation.

Do you have concerns about your child's development?

HELP ME GROW

• Help Me Grow provides resources for families to understand developmental milestones and learn if there are concerns. This helps families take the lead in seeking additional support or referring their child for a comprehensive, confidential screening or evaluation at no cost. Helpmegrowmn.org

The screening is most valuable when completed as soon as possible after the child's third birthday, but must be completed before the child enters kindergarten.

American Red Cross Lifeguard Training -Blended Learning

This comprehensive course is designed to instruct participants in the skills and knowledge needed to become a lifeguard. Course candidates will learn how to recognize, prevent and respond quickly to aquatic emergencies. The course also instructs participants in CPR for the Professional Rescuer, AED and First Aid. Participants will receive certifications in the above - certifications will be presented upon completion of attending all class sessions, passing all written exams, water skills and test. Prerequisites:

- Participant must be 15 years of age or older.
- Ability to pass pretest. Swim 300 yards continuously demonstrating breath control and rhythmic breathing. Tread Water for 2 minutes using only legs. Complete a timed event with 1 minute 40 seconds: starting in the water, swim 20 yards, surface, feet first or head first, to a depth of 7 to 10 feet to retrieve a 10 pound object, return to surface and swim 20 yards on back with both hands holding object, exit the water without using a ladder or steps.
- Certifications received upon completion of course objectives and passing score of 80 percent correct on course final written exams. Lifeguard, CPR-PR with AED and First Aid are valid for 2 years. Will need to renew certifications every two years.
- A minimum of 5 participants will be needed to run this class.
- Bring your swimsuit, towels, snacks (lunch) and water bottle.

Driver's Education

Bloomington Community Education partners with A+ Driving School to offer two driver's education class options:



Option one:

A package of classroom instruction, plus behind the wheel training. Cost: \$395. A \$70 fee is paid to Bloomington Community Education when registering for the class. The additional \$325 is paid directly to A+ Driving School. Students pay \$85 in class to receive their Blue Card. The Blue card is needed to take the permit test. Then 3 payments of \$80 each is paid to A+ Driving School when taking behind the wheel lessons.



Option two:

Behind the wheel training only. This class is for students who have taken classroom instruction as part of their high school curriculum. Cost: \$295. A \$35 processing non-refundable, non-transferable fee is paid to Bloomington Community Education when registering for the lessons. The additional \$260 is paid directly to A+ Driving School when taking behind the wheel lessons.

Students must be 14 1/2 years of age to take driver's education classes. Option one registration can be done online at bloomington.ce.eleyo.com, by phone at 952-681-6111, by mail, or in person at the Bloomington Community Education office.







Attendance:

Attendance will be taken in SLAM camps. You will NOT be notified if your child is absent from a camp unless you specifically request this information. All children must meet in their SLAM classroom for attendance before going to their activity site.

Parent Participation:

Some camps let parents attend the last day of camp to see what was accomplished during the week. Please ask your instructor about last day parent participation.

Sickness Policy

This policy has been put into place to protect your child(ren) and the other participants in the program. Please use common sense when deciding to send your child to one of our programs. If in doubt, please do not send them.

Please do not send your child to our programs if your child has:

- Had a temperature of 100 degrees or more within the past 24 hours.
- Had a communicable illness such as strep throat, pink eye, chicken pox, measles, etc... unless they have been on antibiotics for longer than 24 hours or past the doctor's recommended exclusion period.
- Lice, unless they have been treated and no longer have any nits or eggs visible.
- Vomited within the last 24 hours.

If we discover that one of the above has occurred or the child becomes sick while at one of our programs, you will be asked to make arrangements to pick the participant up immediately.

Concussion Policy

A concussion is a brain injury. Concussions are caused by a bump or blow to the head. Even a "ding," "getting your bell rung," or what seems to be a mild bump or blow to the head can be serious. You can't see a concussion. Signs and symptoms of a concussion can show up right after the injury or may not appear or be noticed until days or weeks after the injury. If your child reports any symptoms of concussion, or if you notice the symptoms yourself, seek medical attention right away and please contact the SLAM office to notify us of the injury. Please refer to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention website for more information: www.cdc.gov/concussion/pdf/ parents Eng.pdf.

Lost and Found

Please label your child's belongings with both first and last name. This includes things such as sweatshirts, water bottles, sunscreen, swim suits and beach towels. Items without names will remain at the program site until the end of the SLAM program.

Severe Weather Policy:

SLAM will hold camps indoors if it is an extremely rainy day. If severe weather approaches, children will take shelter in the designated severe weather shelter.

Disability and/or Medical Support

Please note: Accommodations can potentially take up to two weeks to put into place after all forms are received. SLAM reserves the right to delay enrollment due to processing registration, the need to increase staffing or to gather additional information about the participant.

*Some medical conditions may require Inclusion Services due to the intensity of the need and/or the medical equipment that will need to be utilized (needles, vials, etc.). Due to liability concerns and safety of participants, Inclusion Services must be provided even if the participant is self-sufficient with this type of equipment. Inclusion Services will provide monitoring and guidance if the participant is self-sufficient. If not self-sufficient, Inclusion Services will provide the full support needed.

Limited fee assistance is available for SLAM camps at Olson Middle School based on qualification criteria. Partial assistance may be awarded for one camp per child, per quarter, or until fees are unavailable.

3D Printing: Build Your Own Robot

Instructor: Engineering for Kids, Mpls

Students will be learning the ropes of 3D modeling and printing. They will use 3D pens to understand printing in plastic and use CAD software (Computer-Aided Design) to design parts for their robot to be 3D printed. Looking for a way to keep your child's math and reading skills sharp over the summer? Try GRASP!

GRASP is a nine-week correspondence program for grades K-8 that helps students maintain reading and math skills while they are on summer vacation. Each lesson is constructed to reinforce or reteach typical basic skills generally found in most curricula at a particular grade level. An online version is also available for grades 4-8; but you cannot do both.

One lesson per subject is completed each week for nine weeks.

Each lesson should take approximately one hour per week to complete.

Completed lessons are mailed to a scoring center in the envelopes provided. The lessons are scored, results recorded and returned to the student. Online students will receive feedback immediately.

Students successfully completing at least 7 lessons (70% accuracy) are awarded a certificate. Those successfully completing all 9 lessons will receive a medal soon after Labor Day.

Instruction sheets found in each packet provide all the necessary information to complete each lesson. The online version will be emailed.

Students attending elementary grades at Bloomington Public Schools will have materials sent home with them the last week of school. Middle school and all others will be mailed in early June.
