Below are the titles of required books for your 2020-2021 English class, as well as other titles of works that have been endorsed by students.

You are required to read the novel listed under your specific grade level. Please obtain your own hard copy of the required book (as opposed to a library copy or digital version), as you will need to write in the book, have it in class, and refer to it in discussions.

Here are a few suggestions for annotating as you read your required book:

- Underline key passages that you find interesting or important
- Use sticky notes or marginal notes to mark observations, questions, and connections
- Mark lines that help you understand the characters and plot

Additionally, you must select and highlight at least 3 quotations that are interesting or thought-provoking and be prepared to discuss these quotations in class. There will be a written assessment in September.
