### 10<sup>th</sup> Grade

**All levels:** English II students should consider reading **one (1)** of six (6) texts over the summer:

<i>The Joy Luck Club</i> , Amy Tan	<i>The Sun is Also a Star</i> , Nicola Yoon
<i>Life of Pi</i> , Yann Martel	<i>A Thousand Splendid Suns</i> , Khaled Hosseini
