INFINITE CAMPUS

This summer, we worked extremely hard to develop ways to make the beginning of year completion of forms easier and less time consuming for our families. Many of the forms and agreements that were mailed in the past have now been "digitized" and can be accessed through our website or Infinite Campus. **This process will be replacing Registration Day Packets for 6-12th grades and the Emergency Cards for K-12th grades.** Please take a few moments to familiarize yourself with the information outlined in this [letter](#). We hope that you will find it helpful as we start a new school year. The **REQUIRED ACTION STEPS** for each family are outlined in the letter.

SCHOOL STORE (ON-LINE PAYMENTS)

We have begun the process of accepting on-line payments using our School Store. You can access the School Store on the district website's home page button labeled "School Store (On-Line Payments)". Right now, athletic passes can be

purchased through this process. We offer Family (\$125), Individual (\$75), Student (\$35), and Senior Citizen (\$25) passes. Note: The Senior Citizen pass is good for individuals 63 years of age and older, and is good for all TCC home/away events.

CHROMEBOOKS

We are a 1:1 Chromebook district for all students K-12th grades. Students in KG-5th grade do not need Chromebook insurance as the devices do not leave school. However, students in grades 6-12 have the option of purchasing Chromebook Insurance for \$20 (\$60 family limit). This insurance policy will cover the cost towards damages incurred due to cracked screens, liquid spills, drops, and device failures. Multiple insurance claims may result in future chromebook restrictions and repair fees. The insurance fee does not cover replacement of or damages to the power charger, excessive wear and tear, excessive cosmetic damage, vandalism, negligence of care, fire, abuse, or theft. Replacement fees will be assessed due to excessive damage, vandalism, or failure to return the Chromebook or charger in good working condition at the end of the school year. Chromebook fees are paid on-line in Infinite Campus Parent Portal under "Fees". Students will not receive Chromebooks until fees are paid or declined.

FEES

To pay for fees in Infinite Campus Parent Portal, click on "Fees" on the left side of the main page. Here is the step-by-step details:

1. Click "Add to Cart".
2. Click "My Cart".
3. Click "Add Payment Method".
4. Add "Check, Savings, or eCheck".
5. Click "Submit Payment".

SCHOOLGY

Our K-12 teaching staff use Schoology to communicate with students and families, post assignments and grades, and sometimes include instructional videos. VOLUNTEER FORM

Whiteford Agricultural School District appreciates your willingness to serve as a volunteer in our district and become a substantial and vital part of our school programs! Background checks will be done on an annual basis. The background check process is time consuming; therefore, appropriate lead time must be given to ensure background checks are completed prior to volunteer service at the school or for any function conducted by the school.

GROWING TREE AFTER SCHOOL CHILD CARE PROGRAM

The Growing Tree After School Program is pleased to be able to offer a childcare program on a self-funded basis for Kindergarten through 5th grade. The after-school program is a ministry of the Whiteford Wesleyan Church. The program is licensed through the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs Child Care division. The After School Program will operate during bad weather morning delays, daily after school hours, and early dismissals that are included in the Whiteford Schools yearly calendar until 6pm. Fees are \$6.25/hour for first child, \$5.25/hour for second child, and \$4.25/hour for third and additional children. CONCERNS & QUESTIONS

If a concern or problem arises this school year, it is important that we follow proper lines of communication. Concerns regarding your child and their educational or athletic experience should be expressed directly with the staff member that it most closely involves and should occur at an appropriate time, place, and with a professional tone. This provides a process whereby employees closest to the problem have an opportunity to know about the concern, a chance to work on the problem and are able to effectively work out a solution to the problem that is agreeable to all involved. In all

SCHOOL DELAYS / CLOSINGS

School closing or delay announcements will be sent via the Infinite Campus Messenger systems and announced on the following television stations: Channel 11 (CBS) and Channel 13 (ABC). Announcements should occur no later than 7am. Parents and students are asked NOT to call the school or school officials. When school is delayed due to fog/snow/ice or other emergency conditions, it will be delayed for a minimum of two (2) hours. **It is important to make sure you have updated your contact information in the Infinite Campus Parent Portal.**

FOOD SERVICE

The Nutrition Group will provide the food service program. Meal service begins on Wednesday, September 6th and will include both breakfast and lunch. All students enrolled at our school can receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at NO CHARGE since we are participating in the Seamless Summer Option as part of the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs.

We still need your household to complete the Free and Reduced-Price Meal Application. The easiest way to complete the application is by submitting your information on LUNCHAPP.COM, which can be accessed from the district's website on the Food Service page. If unable to complete it online, applications can be obtained in each school office. Please complete the application and return to the school office.

ATHLETIC FAN ALERTS

If you are a Whiteford Fan, and you want to receive up-to-date changes and cancellations this spring, please go to the Whiteford Agricultural School District website. Under "Athletic Tab", click on the Athletic Calendar. This will take you to our Whiteford Big Teams page. Go to "Join/Login", then go to Get Alerts to set up your account to get texts and emails in real time! From the Fan Dashboard, select "Favorites", click the sports you want updates. BUILDING SCHEDULE START/END CHANGES FOR 2023-2024

During the Bond Project's initial planning stages, a new bus loop was created in hopes of reducing or eliminating traffic congestion at arrival and dismissal. This bus loop will begin at the elementary entrance and extend around the back of the new gymnasium traveling on the east side of the middle school wing to Consear Road. With this new traffic pattern, there is a plan to have the buildings switch/change start and end times. Please make note of the new bell schedules for both buildings.

ARRIVAL/DISMISSAL CHANGES FOR 2023-2024

The district parking lots have been paved, resealed, painted, and receiving additional signage to outline new traffic patterns to improve traffic flow. In order to ensure the safety of our students and staff, we ask that parents/guardians and all others, please follow the guidelines listed below for drop-off and pick-up processes for bus and car riders. There will be no bus traffic in the front of the middle/high school per the previous routine as all bus traffic will now be limited to the new bus loop. **Parents/guardians and student drivers are not permitted in the bus loop areas from 7:30-8:15am**

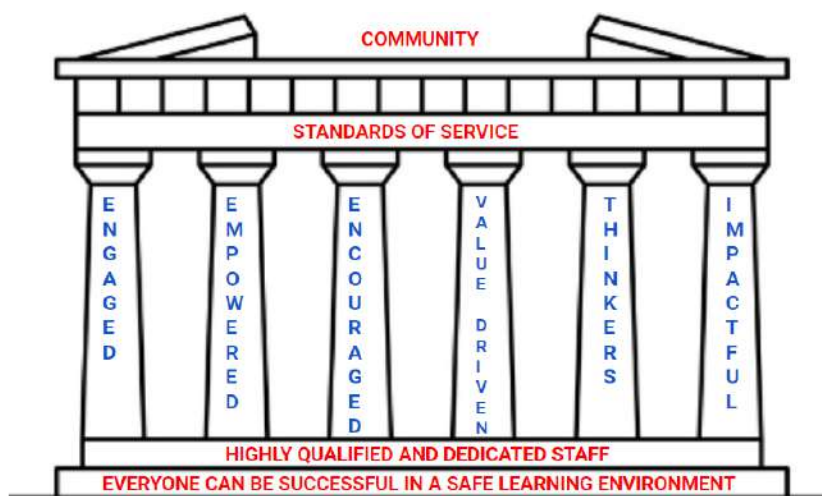
