



ALL-ACADEMIC DEFINITION:

A USA Lacrosse All-Academic Player who exhibits exemplary lacrosse skills, good sportsmanship on the field, represents high academic achievement standards in the classroom, and volunteers within their community.

ALL-ACADEMIC CRITERIA/ELIGIBILITY:

- Must be a Junior or Senior on their varsity or approved scholastic club lacrosse
- Must have played in a majority of their team's games for the current season.
- Must be a <u>starter or significant</u> contributor to their team (plays over half a game or average).
- Has a minimum cumulative (freshman year through application deadline) grade point average of 3.7 out of a 4.0 academic scale. If in doubt, please ask the school guidance courselor for assistance determining acceptable GPAs for a 5.0 scale or trainbutted. GPAs for a 5.0 scale or trainbutted.


Nick Cappuccio finished 3rd in the Division 6 State Meet for the 200m Event!

George Galuris finished 9th in the Javelin and broke the school record!


