Being present in school everyday for every class is critical to their success both in and out of school. Student attendance is strongly correlated to academic achievement, graduation, and postsecondary success (OSDE). No matter your child’s grade or age, their attendance at school is vitally important to their growth, development, and education.

We do understand that there will be times when a student might need to stay home from school due to extenuating circumstances (illness, doctor/dentist appointment, funeral, family emergency, or recognized religious holiday). Parents or guardians contact your child’s school attendance office on the day of the absence be necessary.

It is important to make school attendance a priority. Here are a few suggestions for helping out at home with school attendance...

- Make it the expectation to be at school each day.
- Help your child with daily routines at home that support success at school.
- Try to avoid making appointments that pull your child out of school during the day.
- Don’t let your child stay home unless they are truly sick. Complaints of headaches or stomachaches may be signs of anxiety. (OSDE website)

NOMINATIONS BEING ACCEPTED UNTIL NOVEMBER 22, 2024

- The criteria to nominate someone for the Hall of Honor is...
1. Be a graduate, former employee, volunteer, board member, or community supporter of the district. Graduates should be at least 10 years removed from graduation and employees should be removed at least one year since leaving CPS.
 2. The person must have contributed to the welfare of humanity to an unusual degree, brought unusually positive attention to CPS, or who modeled the highest personal and professional qualities for students.
