Academic Difficulty of Courses

- Level 1: College Prep- Course content, pace, and academic rigor follows standards specified by the <u>North Carolina Standard Course of Study</u> (NCSCOS) with content enrichment where appropriate.
- Level 2: Honors- Course content, pace, and academies rigor place high expectations on the student and surpass standards specified by the NCSCOS. These course demand greater independence and responsibility that Level 1 courses. *This level is suggested for competitive college admission.*
- Level 3: Advanced Placement- Course content, pace, and academic rigor are college-level as adopted by the College Board to prepare students for college.

Academic Difficulty of Courses

- **Honors:** Students must be RECOMMENDED by their current teachers. Test scores are also factored into this decision.
 - If you are recommended for an honors level course and decide you would rather take the course at the CP level, you may do so.

- Foundational: Students who struggle in math have the option of a year-long Foundations of Math 1/ Math 1 course that will help build necessary skills to be successful in subsequent math classes. They will earn the required Math I credit in addition to another academic elective.
 - Students will receive 2 credits for these courses upon successful completion.

Registration Timeline reminders

- Monday, February 28
 - Rising 9th Grade Registration Student Presentation
- Tuesday, March 1
 - Rising 9th Grade Registration Parent Presentation
- **February 28- March 7:** Students work with parents and current teachers to determine best course selection and enter those courses in Powerschool
- March 8-11th: SVHS counselors will with students 1:1 in ELA classes to review student selections and teacher recommendations to ensure prerequisites are met, student and teacher requests are consistent, and all selections are accurate.

Registration Process

- Reviewing options on your Registration Card (*optional)
 - The Registration Card lists all classes available in the county so not all are offered at SVHS.
 - Use the Registration Card to help select your primary electives and your alternates. You will list these on your Registration Worksheet where teachers have signed with their recommendations.
 - Alternates are just as important as primary choices. More than likely you will be placed in at least one of your alternate choices, so please choose wisely.

Registration Process

- Marking your Registration Worksheet (*Mandatory)
 - This has the four year plan on the reverse side to assist your decision-making.
 - Write your choices on the provided worksheet to help guide your selections in PowerSchool.
 This will be given to your counselor when you meet with them to review your selections.


Registration Process

- Entering Course Selections in PowerSchool
 - Sign in to PowerSchool through the Student startup page
 - Click "Class Registration" located on the left of the screen
 - Click on the pencil icon on the right-hand side of the page next to each course subject listed to choose a course in that subject area
 - Once you have selected your course(s), click "okay" and continue to the bottom of the page to hit "Submit"
 - Do this for each core subject (English, Math, Science, and Social Studies)
 - Make sure you register for 4 primary and 4 alternate electives
