- All UNC universities require **at least 2 years** of the same foreign language. Some of the more highly selective schools require 3 to 4 years of the same language.
- Some SC colleges require 3 years.

ACADEMIC DIFFICULTY OF COURSES

- Level 1: College Prep- Course content, pace, and academic rigor follows standards specified by the **North Carolina Standard Course of Study** (NCSCOS) with content enrichment where appropriate.
- Level 2: Honors- Course content, pace, and academics rigor place high expectations on the student and surpass standards specified by the NCSCOS. These course demand greater independence and responsibility than Level 1 courses. *This level is suggested for competitive college admission.*
- Level 3: Advanced Placement- Course content, pace, and academic rigor are college-level as adopted by the College Board to prepare students for college.

ACADEMIC DIFFICULTY OF COURSES

- **Honors:** Students must be RECOMMENDED by their current teachers. Test scores are also factored into this decision (once received in the summer).
 - If you are recommended for an honors level course and decide you would rather take the course at the CP level, you may do so.
 - If you are recommended for CP and wish to take honors, your parent must sign the “Recommendation Waiver.” Students who do this typically struggle in the honors level course.
- **Foundational:** Students who struggle in math and/or English have the option of a year-long foundational course that will help build necessary skills to be successful.
 - Students will receive 2 credits for these courses upon successful completion.

WAIVERS

- Waivers will be available online at Sun Valley High School's website under "School Counseling."
- These will need to be completed, signed by the parents, and turned-in with your registration form at the time of your meeting with a counselor.
- Students **CANNOT** opt out of foundational support classes- Foundations of Math I (Math support) or Reading Across the Curriculum (English support).

REGISTRATION TIMELINE

- Monday, March 9th
 - Registration Presentation at SVHS for **students** during Spartan Block
- Tuesday, March 10th
 - 6:00 pm: Registration Presentation at **SVHS Media Center** for **parents**
- March 9-23:
 - Students work with parents and current teachers to determine best course selection and enter those courses in Powerschool
- March 23-April 8: Students meet individually with SVHS counselors to verify course selections (**Registration must be entered into powerschool BY THIS TIME in order to meet with a counselor**)

REGISTRATION PROCESS

- Marking your Course Selections
 - Utilize the course selection worksheet to pick your top 8 PRIMARY choices in the top section.
 - List the 4 electives you want as alternates in the bottom section.
 - Alternates are just as important as primary choices. More than likely you will be placed in at least one of your alternate choices, so please choose wisely.
 - Have your parents sign this form and return it to us when you meet with a counselor.
 - Use this form to enter your selections in PowerSchool .

REGISTRATION PROCESS

- Entering Course Selections in PowerSchool

- Sign in to PowerSchool through the startup page
- Click “Class Registration” located on the left of the screen
- Click on the pencil icon on the right-hand side of the page next to each course subject listed to choose a course in that subject area
- Once you have selected your course(s), click “okay” and continue to the bottom of the page to hit “Submit”
 - Do this for each core subject (English, Math , Science, and Social Studies)
- Make sure you register for 4 primary and 4 alternate electives


ACCESSING THE ONLINE REGISTRATION SYSTEM

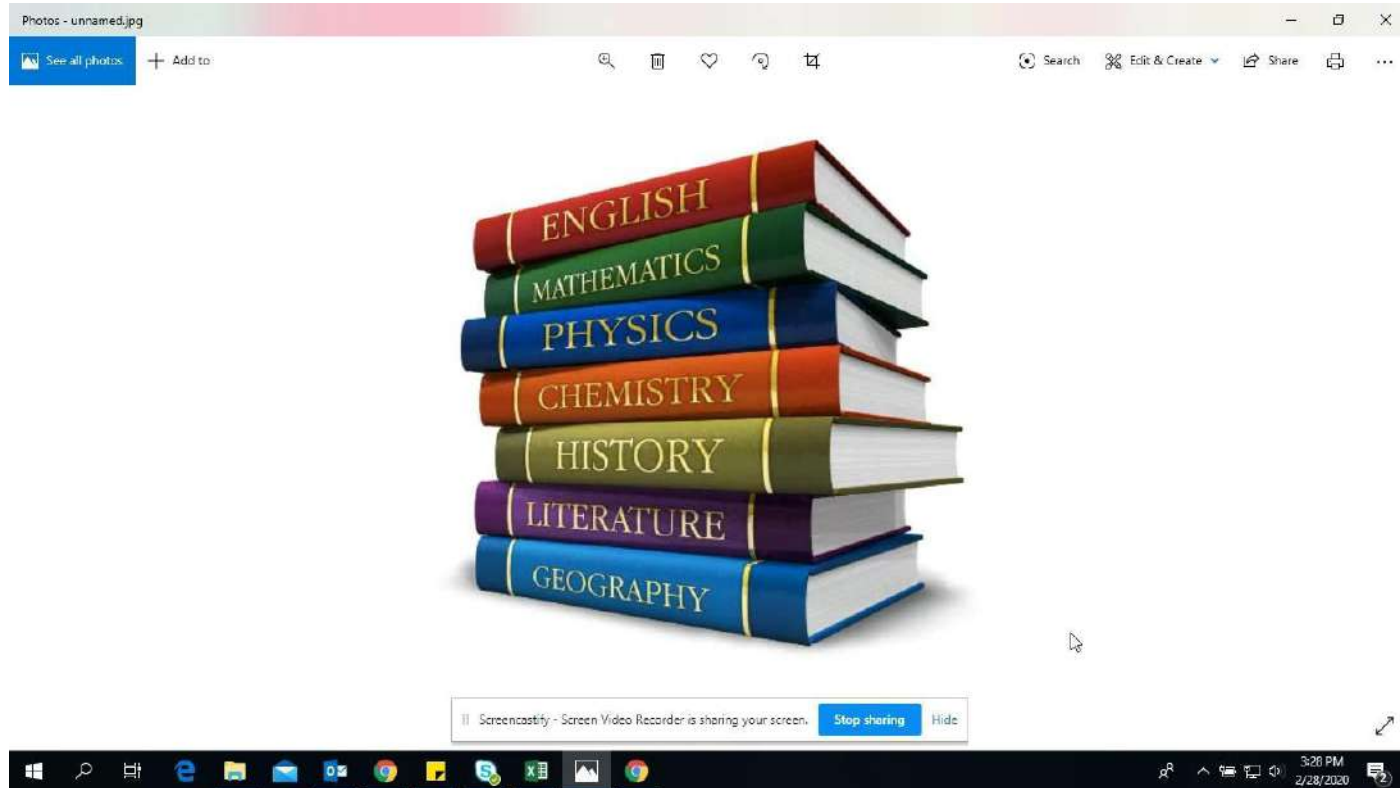
