What will my high school schedule look like?

- ❖ 4 classes per semester
 - ❖ 2 semesters → Classes change AT the semester
 - ❖ 8 classes per year x 4 years of high school = 32 credits
 - ❖ Each class lasts ~ 90 minutes
- (except for 3rd block as this includes your lunch)

Academic Difficulty of Courses

- **Level 1: College Prep-** Course content, pace, and academic rigor follows standards specified by the **North Carolina Standard Course of Study** (NCSCOS) with content enrichment where appropriate.
- **Level 2: Honors-** Course content, pace, and academies rigor place high expectations on the student and surpass standards specified by the NCSCOS. These course demand greater independence and responsibility that Level 1 courses. *This level is suggested for competitive college admission.*
- **Level 3: Advanced Placement-** Course content, pace, and academic rigor are college-level as adopted by the College Board to prepare students for college.

Academic Difficulty of Courses

- **Honors:** Students must be RECOMMENDED by their current teachers. Test scores are also factored into this decision.
 - If you are recommended for an honors level course and decide you would rather take the course at the CP level, you may do so.
- **Foundational Math:** Students who struggle in math have the option of a year-long Foundations of Math 1 / Math 1 course that will help build necessary skills to be successful in subsequent math classes. They will earn the required Math I credit in addition to another academic elective.
 - Students will receive 2 credits for these courses upon successful completion.

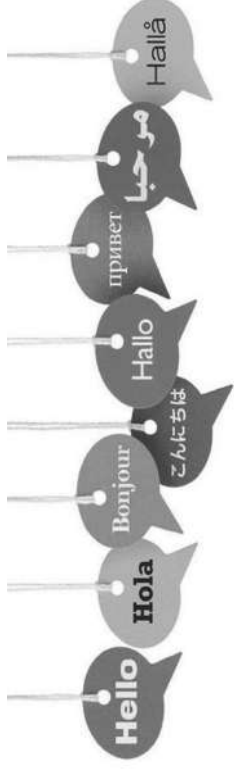

Foreign Language



- A Foreign Language is **NOT** required for graduation.
- All UNC universities recommend but no longer require **2 years** of the same foreign language. Many 4-year universities still require 2 credits in a foreign language for admission however. Some more highly selective schools may require 3 years of the same language.
- We recommend you check the college's website of the school you would like to attend for their admission requirements.

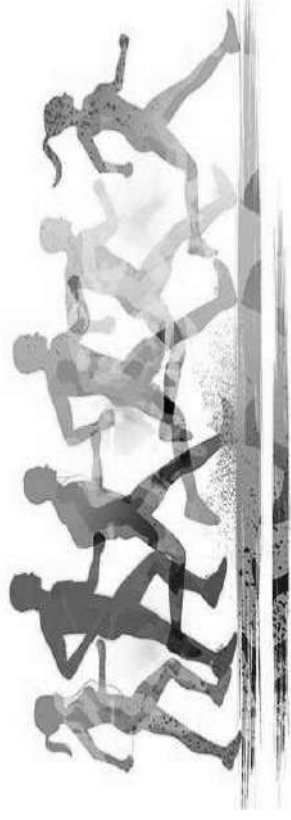

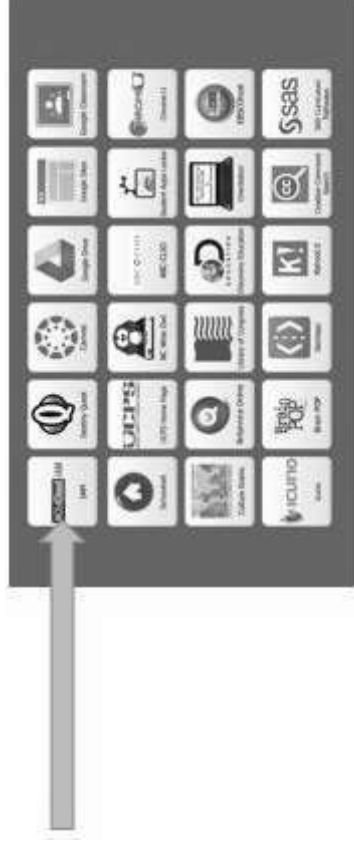
Registration Process

- **Entering Course Selections in PowerSchool**
 - Sign in to PowerSchool through the Student startup page
 - Click “Class Registration” located on the left of the screen
 - Click on the pencil icon on the right-hand side of the page next to each course subject listed to choose a course in that subject area
 - Once you have selected your course(s), click “okay” and continue to the bottom of the page to hit “Submit”
 - Do this for each core subject (English, Math , Science, and Social Studies)
 - Make sure you register for 4 primary and 4 alternate electives

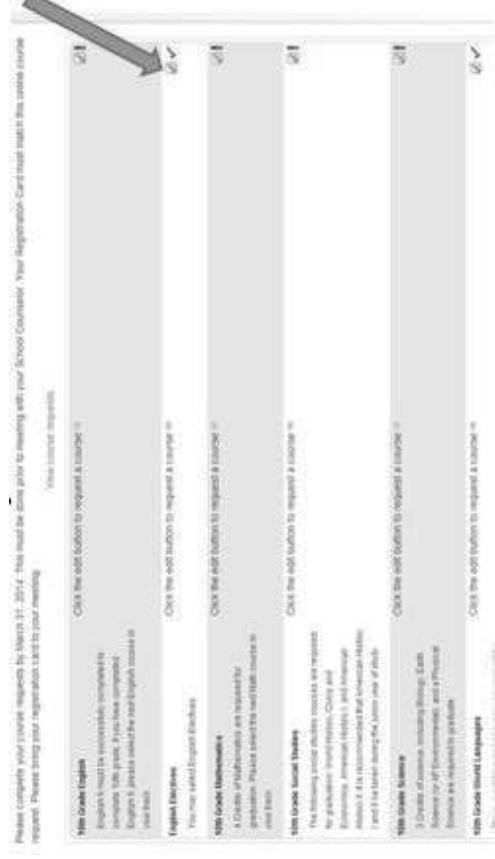
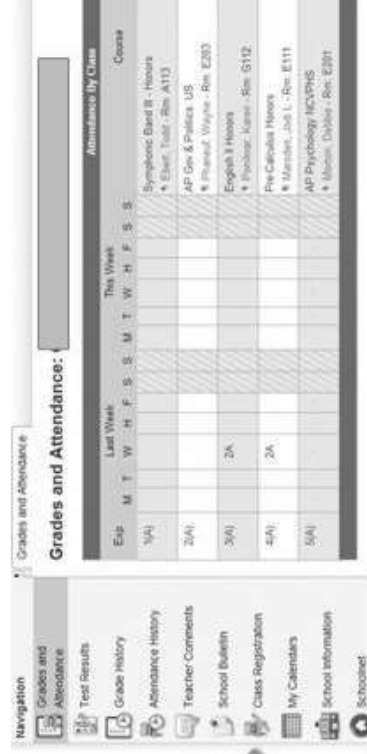
