From the Principal's Desk...

All of us at SWIS are embracing the second half of the school year with a renewed sense of energy and purpose. Our momentum in preparation for all that 2023 brings will continue as there is a lot to prepare students for; new curriculum, mid-year benchmark assessments, Spring MCAS and new challenging projects. As a team, we will continue our mission of providing each student daily opportunities to develop and grow in all areas. The hard work of educating every child in reaching their full potential is the collaborative effort of all of us at SWIS— teachers, students, support staff, and the administration.

January brings much activity to Swanson Road Intermediate School:

Academics - All students have been taking the Mid-year IReady Reading Diagnostic assessment in both reading and math. Grade three will take part in the DIBELS test which assesses students' oral reading fluency, as well as accuracy. Other tools to monitor progress are in place to ensure we are targeting our instruction to address the specific needs of each child.

As a staff we will be discussing and analyzing all testing results to plan future instruction and interventions/enrichments. These tests, along with all assessments, provide us with information to make informed decisions around student learning and guide us in creating experiences for each student to excel before, during, and after school.

WIDA Testing – During the month of January, English Language Learners will be taking the state ACCESS test. This test assesses comprehension, written language and oral fluency. Parents will receive notification of the dates their child will be tested along with helpful test taking strategies. **Communication** – Please maintain continued contact with your child's teacher to seek updates on your child's progress. This is imperative for ongoing growth and success. Teachers use a variety of communication tools to provide ways in which you can stay informed and reinforce/support your child's learning at home.

PE Notes



It's going to be a busy 2023 for the fourth-grade students at SWIS! Many new and exciting units have begun and students are exploring new strategies and concepts. Read on to discover what your child is learning and start a conversation about it.

<u>Math:</u> We will be wrapping up our unit on factors and multiples and will begin our new unit on fractions. Students will quickly discover how applying the skills from previous chapters will be beneficial for learning fractions. Ask your child how factors, multiplication, division, etc... help them with fractions.

Reading: We have started our third unit entitled That's the Spirit! Students will be reading selections around the topics of friendship, helping the community, and liberty and justice. Ask your students how people's words have had an impact on our history.

<u>Writing</u>: Students will be writing personal and fictional narratives. They will draw on their own experiences in order to write a personal narrative and use their imaginations to write a fictional narrative. The students will explore character development, setting, and plot. We can't wait to see our classes get creative!

<u>Science</u>: We have started our unit on energy and motion. Students will learn different forms of energy and how energy is transferred from one object to another.

<u>Social Studies:</u> Students have begun their tour of the United States regions. Ask them to tell you about all the places they have visited. Our explorers will be expected to locate all 50 states. There are many games online to help them practice.
