# SY 2021-22 Enrollment So Far: April 29, 2021 Snapshot

#### **Total students PK-12:**

6,717

### **Enrollment by Grade Span:**

- K-8: 4,459 students
  - Kindergarten: 375\*
  - Grade 1: 502
- BHS (9-SP): 2,081 students

#### Note:

 Kindergarten: Includes only those students fully registered plus estimated METCO and Materials Fee Placements

# SY 2021-22 Forecast vs. Actual Enrollment

## Enrollment projections during Initial budget planning

- Use Cropper projections for 2020-21 for K and 1 students; roll up 2020-21 enrollment for grades 2-12.
- Budgeted sections to account for the Cropper projections of 625 students in K and 630 in Grade 1.

# Winter/Spring Kindergarten enrollment pace is slower than forecasted

- Currently 350 kindergarten and 502 Grade 1 students
- Enrollment will continue to grow through the Spring and Summer enrollment period
- Kindergarten and grade 1 enrollment is uncertain and volatile in the face of COVID recovery

# Anticipating growth and planning for right-sized sections

### Anticipated growth

- ▶ Enrollment is dynamic
- Need to ensure there are sections in reserve for continued growth through spring/summer
