Course Description

The Medical Terminology course is designed to introduce students to the structure of medical terms, including prefixes, suffixes, word roots, combining forms, and singular and plural forms, plus medical abbreviations and acronyms. The course allows students to achieve comprehension of medical vocabulary appropriate to medical procedures, human anatomy and physiology, and pathophysiology. Knowledge of medical terminology enhances the student's ability to successfully secure employment or pursue advanced education in health care. Students will use flash cards, word games, puzzles and classroom activities to enhance memorization of word meanings. Students will also view videos of the human body in wellness and illness. This course is recommended for students in grades 9-12.

Grading

How is the 9 Weeks Grade Calculated?

Major Grades (exams/teats, major projects)- 60%

Daily Grades (daily assignments, homework, *quizzes count as 2 daily grades)- 35%

Reading Grades- 5%

A minimum of three major grades will be given for each 9-week grading period. Quiz grades below a 70 may be retaken and replace the first quiz grade to raise the grade no higher than a 70. All retakes of a Quiz must be completed within one week of the original Quiz. All retakes of Quiz must be done during tutorial times. It is the student's responsibility to schedule retakes.

<u>Absences/Make-Up Work-</u> Students are responsible for obtaining make-up work from the classroom absence folder/itslearning. The number of days allowed to submit make up work for full credit will be equal to the number of days absent. Students needing additional time must seek teacher approval.

<u>Late Work-</u> Per district policy, assignments turned in after the date and time established by the teacher will be accepted up to two class days late, but will only receive 75% credit. Late work received on the third-class day will receive no credit (zero).

<u>Homework</u>- There may be occasions when homework is assigned. Students may need to complete unfinished class work/assignments, read, study for a quiz or unit test, or work on a project.
