TRI-COUNTY SCHOOL CORPORATION

On May 2, 2023, the Tri-County School Corporation will be conducting a special election for the local community to decide to renew the Operations Referendum previously approved in 2017. Information on voting locations and absentee voting can be found on the Tri-County website (trico.k12.in.us) under the "Referendum" title on the right side of the homepage.

The ballot question is listed below:

"Shall Tri-County School Corporation continue to impose increased property taxes paid to the school corporation by homeowners and businesses for eight (8) years immediately following the holding of the referendum to fund academic programming, managing class sizes, Operations Fund expenditures, and any other educational needs with the renewal of the existing maximum referendum property tax rate of \$0.2737? The property tax increase requested in this referendum was originally approved by the voters in 2017 and originally increased the average property tax paid to the school corporation per year on a residence within the school corporation by 47.22% and originally increased the average property tax paid to the school corporation per year on a business property within the school corporation by 44.66%."

To help provide more clarity and understand the lengthy question, the Tri-County School Corporation wants to highlight the factual information on our website, trico.k12.in.us. This information can be found under the title "Referendum" on the right side of the homepage.

The first link is an illustrative taxpayer impact comparing the monthly and annual results of the neutral tax-rate effects of \$0.2727 per \$100 of assessed value. In addition, the illustration shows the historical certified tax rates between 2017-2023. The promise to the Tri-County community was to maintain a rate of \$0.2737, and the Tri-County School Corporation has kept that promise.

The second link is a tax calculator to estimate the impact of the continued \$0.2723. The purpose of the tax calculator is for community members to get a close estimation of the continued investment, both monthly and yearly, in the Tri-County School Corporation. Links to each county assessor's website are included to provide the most accurate information for community members to use in the calculator.

In 2017, the Tri-County community passed an operations referendum with a historical approval rate of over 91%. The passing of the referendum has allowed the Tri-County School Corporation to support 31 staff members and expand our education programs to meet the needs of our diverse learners. The Tri-County School Corporation appreciates the continued support of our students, staff, and schools. Our Remington and Wolcott communities become more vibrant and thriving when our students succeed, benefiting our property and business owners.

A Word from Food Service...

Food Service has made many changes over the years under the direction of IDOE (State) & USDA (Federal) agencies.

We made changes in February to some of the children's accounts due to IDOE Program glitch. If you are a part of the Free/Reduced Program and were a part of the glitch, you would have received a letter. Please check your child's meal account for details.

Our POS (Point of Sale) system is becoming outdated. We are needing to update it. We plan to be making changes over the summer.

After Mid July 2023 parents will need to set up a new account for meal money. Account balances will be transferred over to your new account. Watch for information over the summer. Applications for Free/Reduced will be available after the July date. Reminder: **A new Free/Reduced application must be completed every year.**

Update: Salinas Valley area flooding.

March 10 the Valley area received another 6" of rain. An additional 1-3" is expected on March 13, 14. The Pajaro Levee failed March 11 & the Salinas River Levee breached on March 12. Taking out more crops of Iceberg, Romaine Lettuce, and Strawberries.

The Salinas Valley accounts for 80% of the Nations Vegetable production from April/July. This will result in shortages and high prices.

Parenting with Technology, a Tech Director's perspective.

Raising children today compared to when I was a kid...Wow how that has taken on new meaning at each stage of your child's life. And let's throw in the rapidly growing technology world most of us did NOT grow up with. It's very different but much the same.

We all felt "different" like no one understood us, and our parent's rules were unfair before the Internet existed. Exactly how kids feel today, but often it's amplified due to immediate access to Technology.

Today, children see influencers on YouTube and various social media platforms on their phones. We saw celebrities in magazines we had to purchase.

As a parent, my choice is to talk to my kids about how they plan to use an app, I often download the app and learn how to use it myself, but I might not actively use the app. Or if it is a game, I sit with them and have them explain to me the point of the game and learn how to play with them. (Trust me there are some dumb games out there) Once in a while, I watch the videos they obsessively watch as well with them. I still don't get Minecraft and I still can't apply eye makeup like my kids.

In our house, we often talk about social media posts and how we compare our posts to someone else's. I have three completely different children, my oldest would compare her life to others based on posts, my middle could care less about social media, and my youngest enjoys it, but the posts are all completely her with no care about social comparisons.
