### FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

Believe it or not, but it has already been more than 4 years since the Tri-County school community passed an operating referendum in 2017. The Tri-County community overwhelmingly voted to support a general fund referendum, allowing the school to work with its deficit and operate the school in its current fashion. The referendum passed at a historic rate of over 92% approval rate.



Due to the support of the Tri-County community, the referendum is able to support student learning by supporting 31 full-time positions, 17 certified teachers and 14 classified staff, within the corporation.

Tri-County Primary (TCP)/Tri-County Intermediate (TCI)

- Supports ten (10) certified positions between both TCP and TCI
- Hired nine (9) Instructional Assistants (IAs)
- Returned to one full-time principal at both TCP and TCI
- Full-time nurses at both TCP and TCI
- Full-time counselors at both TCP and TCI

### Tri-County Junior High/High School

- Supports seven (7) certified positions at Tri-County Jr/Sr. High School
- Hired four (4) Instructional Assistants (IAs)
- Returned Jr/Sr. High School Assistant Principal to full time
- Returned Transportation/Athletic Director position to full time
- Hired additional counselor for Jr/Sr High School
- Art Teacher position moved to full time to include Art in the junior high and high school
- Jr/Sr High School Targeted Academic Intervention Coordinator

None of these results would have been possible without the support from the community in passing the general fund referendum in May 2017. As we continue to provide the best educational opportunities for our students, I thought it was important to let everyone know just how impactful the support of the referendum in 2017 was to Tri-County, and for that we thank you.

Thank you for the support to make Tri-County the best small, rural school in the state of Indiana. Go Cavs!


