Information Technology Department

Points of Distinction and Accomplishments:

- The former technology Vision Card was revised to include technology integration and 21st Century Skills based on the International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) National Educational Technology (NET) Standards.
- Completed the configuration/distribution of 2800 iPad's for 8th, 10th-12th grade students.
- Completed the configuration/distribution of 25 Chromebooks carts for 6th-12th grade students.

Insight Statements:

- Technology is no longer a “stand alone” department. It is now an integrated component of Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment.
- Implementation of 1:1 technologies is changing how teachers teach and students learn. Staff is integrating this technology into teaching and learning activities.

Focus in 2015-16:

- Increase the understanding and implementation of a well-developed, comprehensive framework for 21st Century Learning to provide for comprehensive and integrated learning opportunities for students.
- Increase the integration of technology in curriculum, instruction, and assessment, including the inclusion of peripheral technology equipment.
- 1:1 Learning:
 - Deployed 2800 iPad's for 8th, 10th-12th grade students and repurposed 22 iPad carts for E-8th grade students
 - Deployed 25 Chromebook carts for 6th-12th grade students and repurposed 14 Chromebook carts for E-5th grade students
 - Installed 100 Access Points at TOMS
 - Installed 100 Access Points at HOMS
 - Installed 200 Access Points at PLHS
- Refreshed 770 staff desktop workstations
- Refreshed computer labs district-wide
- Infrastructure updates:
 - SAN upgrade
 - LogMojo reporting portal
- Installed new collaboration equipment in conference rooms at the District Office
