TEST CORRECTION POLICY FOR AP STATS

(PUT THIS HANDOUT AT THE BEGINNING OF YOUR TEST AND QUIZ SECTION)

Students may do test corrections to earn back half of the points they lost.

Here are the guidelines:

What: Tests ONLY! It does not apply to quizzes.

When: Must be handed in within TWO class periods following when the test was returned.

Why: To encourage students to learn concepts they did not understand in the assessment.

How: You will need to demonstrate **CLEARLY** that you understand what you did wrong and

how to do the problem correctly.

* For every problem that you want to earn back half the points, you must do the following:

- 1. Messy and difficult to read work will not be accepted or graded!!!!!!
- 2. <u>Corrections are to be attached to the test</u> and are to be done on notebook paper.
- 3. Clearly number the problem.
- 4. <u>Review your mistakes</u> and <u>clearly describe in at least two sentences</u>, specifically what you did wrong; or explain why you were unable to do the problem due to how you prepared (or did not prepare) for this test.

5. Multiple Choice Problems

- Explain why you made the choice you did (see #4 above)
- Explain why each choice is wrong
- For the correct choice, showing every step necessary to get the correct answer clearly.

6. For Free Response, Completely redo the ENTIRE problem

- Clearly explain your mistakes (see #4 above)
- Show **EVERY** step **clearly** necessary to get the correct answer in a clear and neat manner.
- From the question, include all of the information to clearly answer the question (i.e. from the original problem including description of the problem, sketch graphs, etc.)
- You must completely redo ALL PARTS of the question.

7. Corrections must include the following:

- Clearly number the problem(s)
- Skip lines between problems
- Use graph paper for all graphs

Remember this is an opportunity for you to improve your grade and I am expecting quality work!
