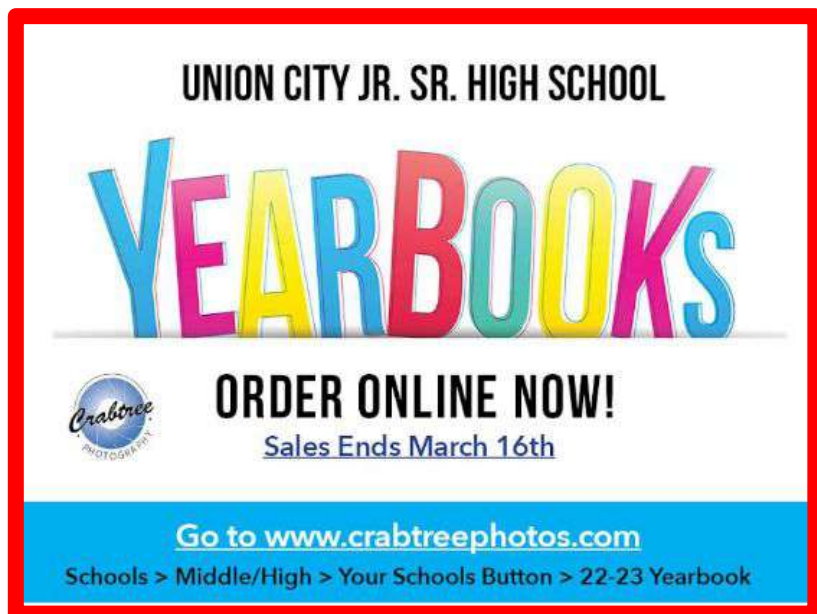

Q: How do I communicate with my teachers better?

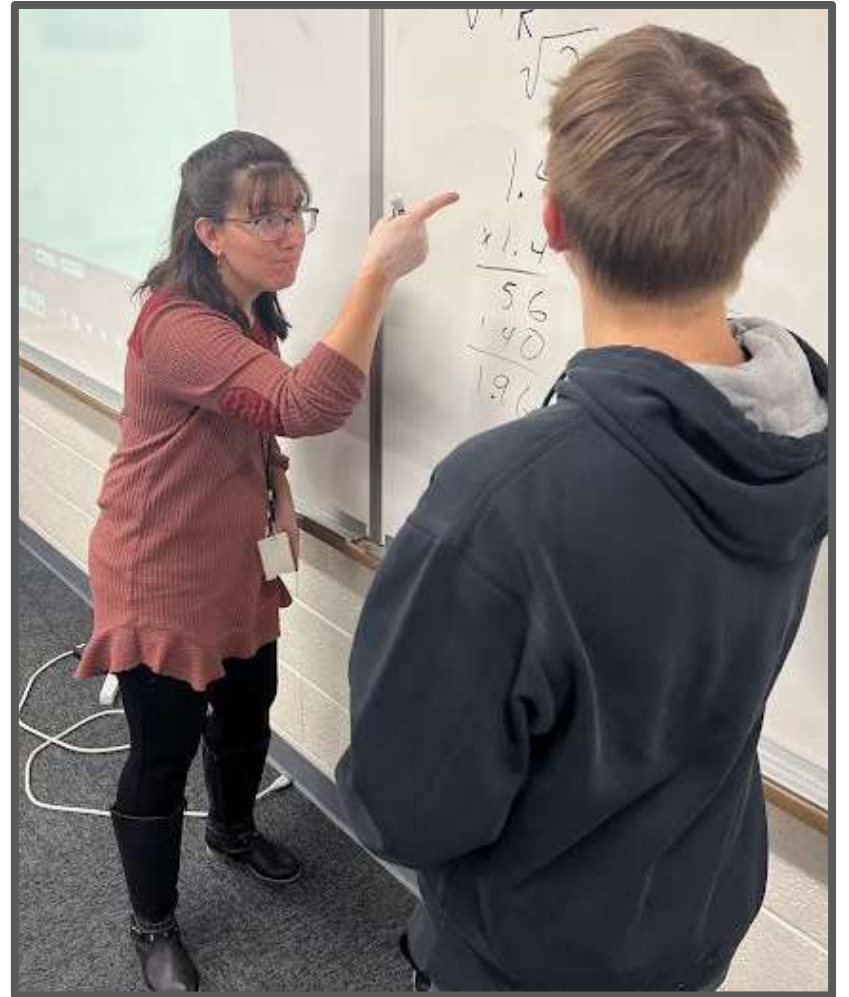

Keyton Tipple (11) Comes Second In The Milk Chug Contest

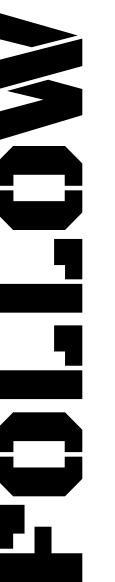
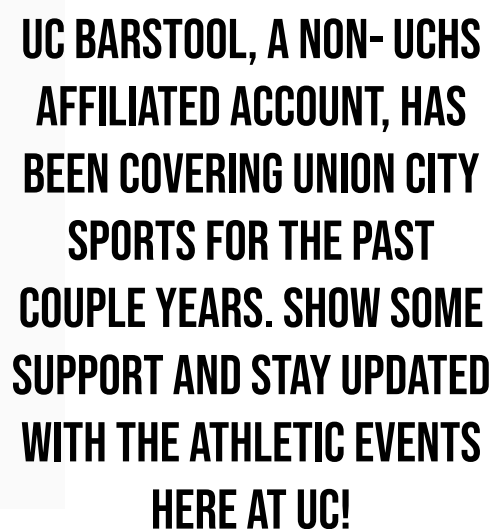
The most electrifying moment was when Junior Kolson Clemons flung the hay bale during the hay bale toss the furthest out of any of the competitors.

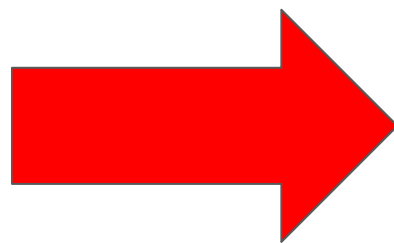

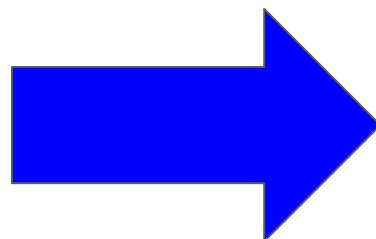

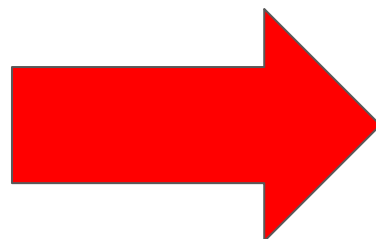
