- 2. *Inferential* Why did the author lose these things?

- 3. *Literal* Where did the author find the arrow?
 - » The arrow was found unbroken in an oak (tree).
- 4. *Inferential* What happened to the song?
 - » The author found it in a friend's heart, meaning a friend knew the song.
