


Roman Catholic Reform

Vatican II- Mass to be celebrated in vernacular, freer relations w/ other Christian groups, new spirit towards Judaism, power to bishops.




Reforms led by: John XXIIIPaul VI





John Paul II Elected in 1978 Traditionalist Against Communism Fostered the growth of the church in unwesternized countries.




Supported Solidarity in Poland
