 Students will learn about the significant advances in science and the arts made by those living in Muslim lands.

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
## Task

After you have created a well written, visually appealing, and exciting account of your findings you will become the educators. You will present a 2 to 3 minute oral and visual presentation of your research.

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## Process

**1. Use the links below to conduct research on Islamic beliefs and practices. You must view the first four sites. As you go through each site use the graphic organizer to help you keep notes that you will need for your project. Also, use your textbook for help.**

### The Five Pillars of Islam
