The Marshall Court- Supreme Court Decisions

Background: John Marshall was the first Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. He served from 1801-1835. His leadership on the court earned him the reputation as "the first among equals." The Court's decision in Marbury v. Madison established the Supreme Court's power of judicial review. If a law or any portion of the law is ruled by the court to violate the U.S. Constitution then the Supreme Court assumed the power to nullify (get rid of) that piece of legislation. During what became known as the "Marshall Court" the Supreme Court made some landmark decisions that had a lasting impact on the history of the United States.
