Martha Pilon: 1st place in oratory, 1st place in spotlight board, 3rd place in oil pastel, 3rd place in onsite painting



MRS. KANE USES FACETIME TO SPEAK WITH HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR

On April 7th, Mrs. Kane arranged for the entire 8th grade and other students and staff to use Facetime to speak with Holocaust survivor Barbara Schechter Cohen from Michigan. As the group of about 80 quietly listened, Barbara talked about how her family narrowly escaped being put in a concentration camp and how they eventually immigrated to the United States in 1945 at the conclusion of WWII. This was particularly special to Anna Pleso because she had previously done a project for Mrs. Kane and had selected Barbara as her Holocaust survivor to research. To meet Barbara in "person" was a unique educational experience not just for Anna but for all of us.


JUNIOR HIGH BASKETBALL RULES!


PROJECT-BASED LEARNING IN MR. CHRISTMYER'S PHYSICS CLASS
