Recipe of the Month

I'm sure we all have started our 25 days of Christmas calendars and the binging marathon of every Christmas movie ever made as you cuddle up on the couch with a cozy blanket and a cup of hot cocoa. The holiday season is slowly coming. Dazzle your friends with these cheerful peppermint bark squares!



SERVINGS: PREP TIME: TOTAL TIME:

12 10 Mins. 50 Mins.

DIRECTIONS

Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Fill the bottom of a large pot with 3" water and bring to a simmer over medium heat.

Reduce heat to low, then place a large heatproof bowl on top. Add semi-sweet chocolate and stir occasionally until chocolate

<u>INGREDIENTS</u>

- 12 oz. semisweet chocolate, chopped
- 12 oz. white chocolate, chopped
- 1/2 tsp. peppermint extract
- 8 candy canes, crushed

has melted. Stir in extract. Pour into the prepared baking sheet and spread into an even layer with an offset spatula. Refrigerate until set, about 20 minutes.

Over the same pot of barely simmering water, place another large heatproof bowl. Add white chocolate and stir until melted. Pour over set semi-sweet chocolate then top immediately with candy canes.

Refrigerate until set, about 20 minutes.

Christmas Plays

On Wednesday, December 18, the first and second hour Theatre classes performed two shows for the Christmas season, *Yes, Virginia: The Musical* and *The Nick of Time Christmas Show.* They both performed in the morning and afternoon for the middle and elementary school students, and in the evening for the public. The second hour class also performed on Friday, December 20 for the high school students.

Yes, Virginia: The Musical is based on a true story about a little girl named Virginia O'Hanlon who wants to prove to her friends that Santa Claus is real, along with her best friend, Ollie, and her new friend, Scraggly Santa. She writes a letter to the editor of *The Sun*, who throws the letter away, not believing all of the nonsense she has read at first. After looking back on her behavior, the editor writes back to Virginia in an editorial telling her that Santa Claus is real, even if there never seems to be proof, he is real in children's hearts all around the world.

The Nick of Time Christmas Show revolves around a small theatrical troupe trying to put together a Christmas show, but as with any show, chaos ensues, such as there being no Christmas tree and the actor playing Santa Claus going missing. In the end, members of the troupe find a Christmas tree, and the Santa actor returns. The cast then celebrates with a big party.

"There were a group of dancing pigeons and different Santa Claus characters from different cultures that were cool to learn about, too," she explained.

Faith Kurtz (11) played the ditzy, yet stressed out, stage manager of the theatrical troupe named Red in the second hour show, *The Nick of Time Christmas Show.* Faith explained that "learning about voice projection and improvisation really helped me out with this show." 




