The authors used expedition journals, oral histories of American Indians, and scholarly biographies as their source materials producing an understated text that is devoid of fictionalizing and speculation. Most of the book takes readers on the journey westward; the final, brief chapter follows what scanty evidence exists about Sacagawea's life after 1806. Sanford and Green document her death in 1884, rather than an earlier assumption that she died in 1812, as is cited in Della Rowland's The Story of Sacajawea (Dell, 1989).
