Freckle

Because we realize that school ended unexpectedly last year, many of our scholars require extra help. The intervention program adopted by the district and our school is FRECKLE. Teachers make assignments for classes to complete based on current skills being taught that scholars complete online daily. There is also a very important component of the program called ADAPTIVE SKILLS which is specific to each child's individual needs. We MUST ensure that not only are scholars getting online to complete class assignments, but also the Adaptive Skill activities. The adaptive skill activities give them opportunities to experience skill work at their individual ability level and works to grow them toward their expected grade level mastery. We monitor the usage and mastery of Freckle very closely so please make sure that your scholar is using it each day.

PARENT SUPPORT!

Thank you for your continued support as we kick off this great school year. As we move forward to success, I need your help with the following:

- Ensure your scholar logs in on time.
- Ensure students are dressed appropriately and are sitting at a table in a quiet space.
- We record our lessons for our asynchronous students, so be aware of the language you are using.
- We record our lessons, so be mindful that!
- You must turn in your student's packet in order for them to receive a grade and be marked present for class for the week. Please turn those packets in on Mondays when you pick up the new packets.
- Please don't verbally or physically discipline students on camera as it is being recorded.
- Don't give students answers while they engage in virtual instruction. Their teacher is present to teach them and its okay if they get the answer wrong. Teachers have techniques to help students find the correct answer on their own.
- Remember students will eventually come back into the building and take their exams individually. In order to grow our scholars and our school we need accurate data from students.
