All car riders will need a car tag. Sign-up in the Media Center. All car riders will wait in the Gym until their number is called.


We heavily discourage students from walking through the parking lot to get into parent's cars.

Early Dismissal/Checkout

- Please sign your child out in the office.
- Students are counted absent if picked up before 11:30 am.
- A written note is required for student pickup by anyone other than the parent. If a child does not have a written note for their teacher, they will be sent home following normal procedures.



Keeping Sherwood Safe

- All visitors must register through main entrance and sign in with the Identity Management software program. K-5th grade students will be expected to walk themselves to class after the 2nd week of school.

- electronic devices



Meal prices: Student breakfast - \$1.20 Student lunch - \$2.50




Adult breakfast - \$1.50 Adult lunch - \$3.50

Student Attendance

- Written notes excusing absences are required within <u>two</u> <u>days</u> of a student returning to school.

TITLE I

PARENT INFORMATION

WHAT IS TITLE I? Title I provides federal funding for schools to help students who are behind academically or at risk of falling behind.

DOES A TITLE I SCHOOL = A LOW PERFORMING SCHOOL?

NO!

HOW DID SHERWOOD BECOME A TITLE I SCHOOL?

 Identification is based on the number of low-income children in a school, generally those eligible for the free lunch program.

• This number, or percentage, is determined by the local LEA (Gaston County Schools).

HOW DOES OUR SCHOOL RECEIVE TITLE I MONEY?

First, the Federal Government provides funding

to each state.







Then, the State Education Agency sends this money to local school districts. The amount a school receives is determined by the number of low-income students at that school.







HOW WILL SHERWOOD USE TITLE I MONEY THIS YEAR?

- Extra Teachers and Teacher Assistants.
- Family Involvement Specialist.
- Educational software.
- Purchase additional instructional supplies for all grade levels.
- Instructional technology.
